TEXANS TEAM NOTES

- The Texans outgained the Rams 420-216 and held the ball 35:10. The 216 yards gained by the Rams was the fewest by a Texans opponent this season. It marked the fourth time this season the Texans had at least 400 yards of offense.
- The Texans have held all six opponents to less than 300 yards of offense this season and their last seven opponents overall to less than 300 yards, dating back to last season. It is the longest such streak in franchise history.
- Houston lost the turnover battle for the fourth time this season, 4-0. The Texans are 1-4 this season when losing the turnover battle.
- The Texans forced three three-and-outs in eight defensive series (37.5 percent). Houston entered the game with the second-highest percentage of three-and-outs and have now forced 21 three-and-outs in 64 defensive series (32.8 percent) this season.
- Houston's first second-quarter scoring drive spanned 78 yards on 8 plays and lasted 5:01, capped by a 20-yard field by Randy Bullock.
- Houston's second second-quarter scoring drive spanned 63 yards on 8 plays and lasted 1:54, capped by a 35-yards field goal by Bullock.
- Houston's fourth quarter scoring drive spanned 47 yards on 12 plays and lasted 6:02, capped by a 1-yard touchdown run by Ben Tate.
- RB **Arian Foster**'s 141-yard rushing effort was Houston's 28th 100-yard rushing performance since 2010, the most in the NFL in that time.
- St. Louis won the toss and elected to receive.
- Houston's captains for the game were ILB **Brian Cushing**, WR **Andre Johnson**, P **Shane Lechler**, QB **Matt Schaub** and DE **J.J. Watt**.
- Inactive players for the Texans were QB **Case Keenum**, RB **Cierre Wood**, ILB **Tim Dobbins**, T **Andrew Gardner**, G **Cody White**, OLB **Sam Montgomery** and DE **Tim Jamison**.

INDIVIDUAL PLAYER NOTES

K RANDY BULLOCK

- Kicked two second-quarter field goals, connecting from 20 and 35 yards. He is 9-of-14 on field goals this season.



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RB ARIAN FOSTER

- Had 20 carries for a season-high 141 yards. It was the 25th 100-yard rushing game of his career. Since 2010, Foster leads the NFL with 24 100-yard rushing performances. He also had a season-long run of 23 yards in the second quarter.
- Totaled 198 yards from scrimmage (141 rushing, 57 receiving). It marked the fourth-most scrimmage yards in Foster's career.
- His 22-yard run in the second quarter put him over 5,000 yards rushing for his career in his 57th career game, tying him with Emmitt Smith for the 13th fastest in NFL history to reach 5,000 yards..

- Became the fourth undrafted player to reach 5,000 yards rushing and the fastest to do so. Among undrafted players, Willie Parker (2004-10) previously reached 5,000 yards rushing the fastest, in his 66th game, followed by Priest Holmes (1997-07) in his 77th game and Kevin Mack (1985-93) in his 94th game
- Had four receptions for 57 yards including a long of 41 yards, his longest reception since Nov. 13, 2011 at Tampa Bay.
- Had 144 yards from scrimmage in the first half, the second-highest first-half total in his career. Foster had 190 on Oct. 23, 2011 at Tennessee.

TE GARRETT GRAHAM

- Had two receptions for 25 yards, including a long of 20.

TE RYAN GRIFFIN

- Caught the first pass of his NFL career, a 10-yard reception in the fourth quarter. Griffin finished with two receptions for 18 yards.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- Had three receptions for 47 yards.



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WR ANDRE JOHNSON

- Extended his streak of consecutive games played with a reception to 107 and his franchise record or games played to 144. He had seven receptions for 88 yards.
- Passed Muhsin Muhammad (860) and moved into a tie with Jimmy Smith for 17th place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 862. He entered the game with 855 career receptions.

QB MATT SCHAUB

- Completed 15-of-21 passes for 186 yards, no touchdowns, no interceptions and a rating of 98.5 before leaving in the third quarter with an injury.

RB BEN TATE

- Scored his first touchdown of the season and seventh of his career on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter.

QB T.J. YATES

- Spelled Schaub in the third quarter and completed 12-of-17 passes for 98 yards and two interceptions for a 45.3 passer rating.

HEAD COACH GARY KUBIAK (Transcribed by Tiffani Walker)

(on his emotions after the game) "It doesn't matter how many good things we do right now because we do just so many poor things. I'll just say this – for the past few weeks the finger has been pointed in one direction a lot. But we sprung leaks all over the place today as a football team. We got our butt kicked as a football team. (Head Coach) Jeff (Fisher) and his team did a great job. We just seem to make too many mistakes, key mistakes. Obviously a lot of stuff that is going on is good, but can't overcome the mistakes right now."

(on if at some point if a player has to own up to mistakes and him not taking all the blame) "Damn right they do, but it's also my job to make sure we don't have them. First thing I do every day is I look at myself. I'm not just saying that. That's not just me saying that to say that, that's the way I operate, that's the way I always operate. I'm the coach of this football team, and we're out there doing numerous things to hurt ourselves over and over again. It's my job to have the people out there who won't continue to put themselves in that situation."

(on the injuries to QB Matt Schaub and S Danieal Manning) "Matt's got a little bit of everything on that one leg, so we'll take a look at it. Manning's got a knee we'll take a look at. (FB) Greg Jones has an ankle and (CB) A.J. Bouye has a hamstring."

(on depending on the defense and their play) "Like I said, we sprung leaks everywhere today. We did not play good defense in the first half, and they went right down the field in the third quarter and they went 80 yards in the third quarter. And of course we give them points. Like I said, it was across the board. Special teams, big turnover for a touchdown. It was everywhere. I just made the point, there has been a lot of fingers pointing in one direction, and I continued to say that there are a lot of issues and obviously there were a lot of issues today."

(on WR DeAndre Hopkins' fumble and if that caused the momentum change and WR DeVier Posey getting more reps) "Posey is just getting more reps because he deserves them. He has been coming along, getting healthy, doing a good job. I think what happens is when you're doing things the way we've been doing them, and all of a sudden, what were we? On the 10-yard line when he fumbles the ball? It gets to be a confidence thing with what's going on. You're sitting there moving the heck out of the ball, I think we punted once in the first half, and I think we punted two or three times all day long. When you just continue to have those things happen to you, the positives can't outweigh the negatives at the end of the day."

(on everyone pointing the finger at QB Matt Schaub the past few weeks) "I think there has been a lot of talk about our quarterback in the last few weeks. As I tell you all the time, this is a team game and we have a lot of issues to get fixed: coaching and playing. And, today was a great indicator. As I said, we sprung leaks in every phase, every phase in the game."



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(on the team having as much talent and how the team had a breakdown across the board - offense, defense, special teams) "It's my job to figure that out. My job to figure it out."

(on what the QBs learn from today, especially QB T.J. Yates) "He got some reps to look at, and you know he definitely made his share of mistakes too. He's got some from last week and this week to go over, for us to look at as coaches. But he's got the same responsibility when he plays as the other guy. And the other guy (QB Matt Schaub) played pretty darn good before he got nicked up and got hurt. So, he has to protect the ball better."

(on if QB Case Keenum could be active next week) "I have to wake up tomorrow and start from scratch with what we're doing and then we'll see where we go against Kansas City. Monday and Tuesday won't be any different, from an evaluation standpoint, than last week was."

(on noticing an advancement in FB Greg Jones' blocking ability improving) "He's played good. We sit here and run the ball and (RB) Arian (Foster) averages seven yards a carry. We ran the heck out of the ball. We didn't finish some of those things down there, obviously, and we turned the ball over in the red zone twice, but Greg has played better and better for us."

(on the team possibly having bad luck) "(WR) Keshawn (Martin) played with a very banged up shoulder. He played for us today nicked up, and we knew that. That's why (S) Danieal (Manning) was the starting kick returner. But, when Danieal went out, Keshawn went back there and it looked like he got hit right on the shoulder. I don't know if it's the one that was hurt or not, so I don't know."

TACKLE DUANE BROWN (Transcribed by Trevor Caswell)

(on fans blaming Head Coach Gary Kubiak for loss) "It's not his fault. We play the game. The coaches put you in position to be successful. We have to play the game. We are the eleven in between the lines that have to go out and execute our game plan; it's as simple as that. He can't control penalties and turnovers; that's on us as football players and men out there battling to get the job done. It's not his fault and anybody who says that, is wrong."

(on the fans cheering for QB Matt Schaub's injury) "It's disgusting. I don't want to address them first; I want to address the fans that were there until the end cheering us on into the tunnel. We appreciate you loyal fans and the fans that stick by us. For the fans that cheered when he got hurt, that's disgusting. You can feel how you want about him as a player, but this is his livelihood and how he provides for his family. When a man goes down and he is not able to get up, you don't know what is wrong with him at that point; that could be the last play of his career and for you to applaud at that – I have no words for that. Shout out to the fans that stick by us; we really appreciate y'all."

(on lack of scoring) "I have no idea. We are doing a heck of a job moving the ball. We are getting where we need to be and in scoring position, but it just isn't happening. We are settling for three, or we are giving the ball up to the other team. We have to get out of this funk. We have to get touchdowns. We are moving the ball well; we had 400 yards of offense, but it doesn't matter when you don't score. We have to find a way to get into the end zone."

(on how the team can recover) "We just have to stay mentally strong. This is one of the toughest points I have been in in my career, but we all have to be mentally strong. You can't hold your head down. We have another game next week and we have to find a way to win heading into our bye week. We just have to go from there."

LINEBACKER BRIAN CUSHING (Transcribed by Matt Bodiford)

(on the loss today) "We aren't playing to our capabilities and that's very disappointing and frustrating. We come in and work hard, and we try to figure this out. For four weeks in a row now we just haven't gotten it done. We haven't gotten close to getting it done. We know we've lost in bad fashion. I just know the biggest thing is staying positive. I know this team really well, and I know we have a ton of potential. This could swing we're just trying to figure out how to do it."

(on how to channel your frustration in to a positive outcome) "Just know that we have a shot every week to go out and prove ourselves. Obviously 2-0 we started out well, and the last four weeks it hasn't. We just have to stay positive, not get down on each other. Just know we can get on a roll, and that's what we're trying to do."



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(on concern the season is slipping away) “Nope, no concern. The talent, the confidence we have in this room, we’ve just been on a bad streak. We gotta turn it around and get on a hot streak. That’s all it comes down to. We just have to start winning one game at a time.”

(on being worried when multiple things go wrong) “Yeah, you know obviously I’m worried right now because we’re losing, and we’re losing bad. It just seems like things have just kind of unraveled in games. Next thing you know we’re down 10, we’re down 20, and the game is out of hand. We got to figure it out. As simple as it sounds, we’ve got to figure out how to start playing better football.”

(on the faith in Head Coach Gary Kubiak) “I’m 100 percent confident. Coach gets us ready to play football. The bottom line is we’re not going out, and putting the product on the field. We’re not playing our best football. This isn’t about Coach Kubiak. Coach Kubiak prepares us perfectly for games. What it’s coming down to right now is us not executing, and not finishing football games.”

RUNNING BACK ARIAN FOSTER (Transcribed by Cali Roper and Rachel Jacob)

(on the ‘21’ personnel formation during the first drives and FB Greg Jones’ development and how he has helped with the running game) “He’s getting better. He is getting better each week. I’m counting on him in the running game, down the stretch. We are going to try to continue to perfect that aspect of our game.”

(on what is going wrong considering the Texans have so much talent) “It is just playing bad. We’re not playing good. We aren’t executing when we need to, converting third downs, staying on the field, giving our defense a chance—we are just putting them in terrible situations, turnovers, penalties. You’re not going to win in this league like that. We need to check ourselves.”

(on him appearing to be back in his old form and if that can be contributed to a change in the blocking scheme) “No. They’re doing what they’ve been doing all year. I was just getting back in to the football state because I missed so much of the off season because of a couple injuries. It’s just me getting back into the swing of things.”

(on the blocks by WRs DeAndre Hopkins and DeVier Posey) “I think if you study football, good rushing teams, they usually have the best downfield blocks and I think that is what our guys are starting to realize, that they are an intricate part to the running game. That was a big part of our running game in previous years with guys like Kevin Walter. Getting them acclimated to blocking downfield, they are doing a good job.”

(on where the team goes from here) “We’ve got to work. It’s not a secret. Back’s against the wall, we are in these games that we are losing. They get out of control but we still feel like we can play with anybody in this league. We’ve just got to go back to work and go back to the basics. We’ve got to ignore the noise outside and keep working.”

(on where penalties are coming from) “Any time you have penalties, it means you are not disciplined. It means you are not focusing. It means you are not harnessing your obligations as a player on this team. That’s it. There is no excuse for it. Penalties are self-inflicting wounds. You have to stay away from those if you want to be successful at this level and we are not doing that right now.

(on feelings when fans cheer due to QB Matt Schaub getting injured) “That is just tactless and tasteless. I was extremely heated at that. They have to go home and look at themselves in the mirror and if they were born to hurt a man, that’s fine. They can do what they do. The fans can get emotional. That is just not how I was brought up. That is not the kind of man I am. I’ve got to go home and raise a daughter, and teach her right from wrong. That is just not something you do. I don’t care how you feel about a man. You don’t kick him when he is down.”

WIDE RECEIVER ANDRE JOHNSON (Transcribed by Hank Nathan)

(on how worried he is about this team right now) “All you can do is worry about yourself. All I can do is go out and prepare and make sure I’m ready to go every Sunday. That’s all I can do. You can’t perform for anybody else on this team. All you can do is make sure you’re ready to go and give it your best effort. You’re out there to help your team win. That’s pretty much all you can do.”

(on if the team’s focus is off) “I don’t know what it is. There have been talks for the past three weeks. I’m tired of hearing the same talk. It’s been going on for a while. The only you’re going to get it done is by playing. Everybody



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has to look themselves in the mirror and find out what gets them going on Sundays when we have to play games.”

(on the team hitting rock bottom last week and where the team is now) “Because of the expectation level around here, things have changed and everybody expects more. When you’re not doing well, everybody’s going to point the finger or what not. I think that’s why they said it feels like rock bottom. Nobody thought we would be in this position that we’re in right now after six games. It’s a disappointment. You’ve got 10 games left and somehow we’ve got to find a way to win these 10 games. That’s pretty much it.”

(on fans cheering when QB Matt Schaub went down with an injury) “No class. It’s bad when members of the other team are saying that’s messed up that they would do something like that. It just shows no class. It wasn’t all of the fans, but those are the same people when you’re out somewhere with your family and you tell them they can’t have an autograph right now, they are the same people that tell you you’re rude. It’s no class. It just shows what they’re all about. You don’t cheer about anybody being injured. I don’t care who it is. Guys lay their bodies on the line out there on that field. Some guys get injuries and it affects them their whole lives. For them to cheer about something like that, it just shows they have no class.”

(on his thoughts on Head Coach Gary Kubiak) “Your quarterback, your head coach, when things aren’t going right, all of the heat always comes to those two guys. You hate for anybody to go through it. It’s part of the business. I think Coach Kubiak will do a great job of handling the situation. Like I said before and in the past, I think he’s a great coach. What he’s done since he’s been here has been amazing. He’s helped turned this franchise around. Like I said, he’ll deal with it well and we’ll get through it.”

(on if today’s performance was embarrassing) “They just pretty much came in here and beat us. It wasn’t a pretty sight. They came here and did what they were supposed to do and we let them do it.”

(on trying to figure out a solution and how frightening it is that there isn’t a clear solution) “I think the only solution is guys looking at themselves in the mirror and being ready to play on Sunday. I think that’s the only solution. Other than that, I don’t really think there’s a science to this. You’ve got to be ready to play on Sundays. That’s pretty much it.”

CORNERBACK JOHNATHAN JOSEPH (Transcribed by Lance Jaramillo)

(on people blaming Texans head coach Gary Kubiak) “It didn’t have anything to do with coach at all. Obviously he’s had great years here before. He’s put us in a position to win. As players we have to go out and execute and get the job done. The head coach can only do so much throughout the week to get us ready for Sunday and I think he’s done an excellent job of that. He’s not creating the penalties, he’s not creating the turnovers, he’s not fumbling the ball and giving them touchdowns. That’s all on the players so we have to take responsibility.”

CORNERBACK KAREEM JACKSON (Transcribed by Stephanie Weaver)

(on fans cheering when QB Matt Schaub went out injured) “It was ridiculous. It goes to show at the end of the day who all is with you. There is nobody but us in this locker room. Like I said, we are family. When things are good, they ride the bandwagon with you. They are step by step with you. As soon as things get bad, they boo and do all the other stuff. To be honest, we don’t care about that. We don’t care about who is booing. For us as a group, we have to get better as a team.”

(on if the defense’s amount of time on the field was a cause for more touchdowns by the Rams) “It doesn’t matter how long we are on the field. We have to stop the other offense. We didn’t today. It’s as simple as that.”

(on if he feels he is being targeted by officiating crews for penalties) “I don’t know what the case is. I don’t know what the refs are looking at as far as what I’m doing wrong. I’ve just got to play. I’m won’t change how I play. In my opinion, I think I’m doing what I’m supposed to do. I’m relying on my technique, being on top. I thought we had the right look for the ball and the player just as much as the receiver did. It seems like we are coming out on the short end of the stick as far as doing things right as a defensive player. I guess that is what the game is going to now.

NOSE TACKLE EARL MITCHELL (Transcribed by Nida Chaudhry)

(on thoughts about today’s game) “We’re just trying to figure out a way to win. Obviously, this is frustrating. We have to get back to the drawing board and figure out how we’re going to win and get on a winning streak.”



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(on what Coach Gary Kubiak said after the game) “Pretty much what you think. It’s unacceptable. We’ve got to be better in all aspects of the game. We’ve got to figure out what we have to do because we know that we’re much better than this. It’s just frustrating to come out like that off the field.”

(on the confidence of this team when same mistakes continuously happen) “That’s the thing. We are a team, we are very resilient, we are very optimistic. That’s why we don’t let it defeat us. That’s one thing I like about this team is that we just feel like we can’t be broken by a lot this because we know we’re much better than this. We know that for some reason we’re just going through some tough times.”

(on how the team can keep the lead defensively) “Obviously, it’s tough when you’re not winning, but on paper that’s one thing. Me, personally, I just feel like we’ve got to do what we’ve got to do to help us win games. If you feel like you’re the best defense in the league, you can help your team win by scoring touchdowns on defense. That’s something we can do and that’s something we can get better at.”

OUTSIDE LINEBACKER BROOKS REED (Transcribed by Hank Nathan)

(on how he feels about the game) “Aggravated. Confused because we’re just trying to figure out what we have to do to be successful. It’s pretty simple, we just need to prepare better somehow, some way. That’s something we can control.”

(on how shocked he is that the team has lost four in a row) “Definitely not used to it. I’ve been here since 2011 and, so right now, I’m experiencing, for the first time, a setback, some adversity and I’m interested to see, as a team, how we’ll respond.”

(on what Head Coach Gary Kubiak said to the team) “Disappointment. He knows what we’re capable and we’re not performing up to his expectations, which is 100 percent spot on. In every category, you can say we can improve there.”

(on trying to figure out a solution and how frightening it is that there isn’t a clear solution) “We have no choice but to try different things during the week and just try to spark something. It’s something we have to do. We have to try different things during the week and see if that makes a difference.”

(on how much differently the team feels after this loss than last week) “Both are pretty bad. Both are pretty disappointing and leaving you feeling that we can play a lot better, and still not pointing any fingers. As a defense, we need to play better in situations where we have to, where we need to get off the field. We can’t let teams score on us, especially in the red zone. When they’re in the red zone, we can’t let them score.”

FREE SAFETY ED REED (Transcribed by Matt Bodiford)

(on the game today) “We came out to play a football game today, and we didn’t play our best football. Obviously, we had a lot of mistakes. We can’t have the small penalties, the personal fouls, pass interference, turnovers. We played our absolute worst football these past two weeks. We have to change it.”

(on why the losses continue to happen) “As a team we didn’t play well. As a whole we didn’t play well, and that’s top to bottom. We work hard, we work really hard, and we want to come out and win every game. Obviously, that’s not going to happen. This is a professional league, we have to make our plays, and we can’t give up plays. We all made mistakes today that contributed to a shellacking, a beating by a team we really gave everything to. They are professionals, and hats off to those guys. They came out and they executed their game plan to a tee. We have to execute ours better, and we will.”

(on the snowball effect of bad things happening and get the momentum back) “That’s the thing, you have to change it. You can’t let it snowball. It’s been four games, but the season is nowhere near over. We still have Kansas City coming up, which is going to be a tough game, because we know how they’ve been playing. We have to continue to work, and figure out what we can do to correct the little things. That’s what’s been costing us. The little things are costing us, and it’s becoming big. The little things become big when you give them 15 yards here, or a 30-40 yard gain. It takes the air out of a team, the momentum we had coming in. The excitement we had, those small detail things that you’re not doing is going to cost you.”



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(on if the intensity is there) “Yeah, oh yeah the intensity is there. We work really hard. I’ve been around hard working teams, and I see the same things. We’re working hard to do everything we can do to work on Sundays. It’s the little things that have been costing us. It’s been Christmas in September, and October, we’ve been giving a lot of gifts away. We have to take that away, and be Scrooge around here. We have to turn that around, and correct the little things that are going to get us over that hump. You’re going to make mistakes, none of us are perfect. When we do have those mistakes, we can’t let them elevate the way they have been.”

DEFENSIVE END ANTONIO SMITH (Transcribed by Lance Jaramillo)

(on how bad this loss feels) “Pretty bad. You know there’s probably no words to explain it. Pretty bad.”

(on people who will blame the loss on Gary Kubiak) “I’ve been in situations like that before. I think when people get in to that, when bad things start to happen, the easiest thing to do is point the finger and think that you know what’s best. This team is going through something right now and the best thing this team can do, and anybody who truly cares about the team, is band together.”

(on why this downward spiral has happened so quickly) “I’ve been trying to figure it out myself. I’ve been dreaming about it or had nightmares about it. It’s constantly on my mind, you know? Keeping me from rest. I have yet to find the answer. We’re heading through a downpour of adversity and with my beliefs, the only way you can get out of that is to continue to believe and continue to hold fast to the things that we know we are made of. We can’t get down on each other because I’ve seen it happen. You don’t even try to do it, but you just start listening to all the things that are being said, and before you know it, you’re in a losing frame of mind, and that’s one of the hardest things ever to get out of.”

(on fans cheering when Houston Texans QB Matt Schaub left injured) “That disappointed me. Truly disappointing me. To think our fans that cheer for us don’t have emotions is to be a foolish man. I know that our performance affects them too. It disappointed me that they would cheer when somebody goes down hurt or they would cheer a man’s downfall.”

(on the fight and effort left in the team) “All I’ve seen is fight and that’s the strange thing about it. All I’ve seen is fight. All I’ve seen is people time after time committing more and more to trying to figure out what we need to do to get us back to a winning frame of mind.”

(on if the team is pressing too hard and trying to do more than they can) “I think we’ve been through that and we’re trying to fix that, but that always happens when stuff continues to pile up on you in a bad way. You keep trying to figure out how you can shake it off, but you’re only human, and when the pressure’s on you, you’re always trying to figure out a way to help your team to spark a light, but some of the things that are going on I’ve never heard of. Like some of the fluke things that have happened to put us in a hole.”

(on the penalties being from frustration) “Yeah. None of the penalties I’ve seen, I haven’t watched the film, was anything other than trying to make something happen or trying to make a play and the penalties that happened could have went either way. That 50 yard penalty with pass interference, man.”

(on the fight of the team) “One thing you don’t want is to settle in and quit. Anybody that isn’t fighting for you and just settled for what is here, has quit.”

(on if anyone has quit) “No. I haven’t seen it in anybody.”

(on if it’s difficult to stay positive when the offense is struggling the last few games) “No it isn’t difficult because we’re struggling too. We are truly struggling too. It’s hard to find out what’s going on. You got to look at the film and see what exactly is going on, but it’s starting to seem like teams are having our number at the right opportunity to have our number. I look up at the score board again and see the least amount of yards an offense can ever have with that many points on the board, but as a defense you feel like you got beat up and down the field because in the moments where we needed to stop them, we did not stop them and that’s the bottom line.”

(on if it feels like they’re giving games away) “No, it doesn’t feel like we’re giving games away because of how hard everybody is fighting. Everybody is committed more than I’ve seen this team ever commit to try to get something changed. When I get to looking at everything I don’t see that type of mind frame.”



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(on what will change the momentum) “I’m trying to figure that out myself. I’m racking my brain. I think the only thing we can do now is band together and stay positive and keep doing what we believe in and assess ourselves and see what exactly is happening to us to cause the frustrations, to cause the penalties, and to cause some of the plays being made on us. You can blame the penalties, but plays are being made on us too.”

(on St. Louis Rams QB Sam Bradford saying they knew they had the Texans beat in the 3rd quarter) “They were up by a lot of points in the third quarter. Anybody can see that. It doesn’t take a prophet to know that. That’s probably why they felt that way, because they were up by so many points.”

(on St. Louis Rams QB Sam Bradford saying the Texans defense didn’t give them diverse looks) “That’s exactly what I just said a second ago. When you truly assess things, it seems like teams got something on us or have our number in some kind of way. I don’t think that him (QB Sam Bradford) saying that makes him any sort of prophet or anything, but the third downs we did have them in, were pretty short third downs.”

(on RB Arian Foster) “He was the one shining light on our team today and you’ve got to tip your hat to him. But, I know Arian and if our team isn’t winning, it’s nothing to him. It’s the same way with everybody on our team. You just see that in him. You see the fight he had for you and the sacrifice he has for you, but we have to find a way to get a win.”

(on if it’s surprising the team hasn’t played their best game yet) “It’s definitely surprising. I think everybody that came in with the mind frame that we had to start off the season like we started last year, but obviously there’s something going on right now that has us in a position where we need to look within and find out what we need to do. (Head) coach (Gary Kubiak) said it quite plain, ‘you can’t point the fingers at each and every individual or a different side of the ball, you have to point the finger at yourself.’”

(on understanding why this downfall is happening with all the talent and effort on the team) “Definitely hard because during the week we had one of the best, physical and competitive practices I’ve been around here and we felt good coming in to the game, but to have some of the things that happened in this game that tests your perseverance, that tests your will, it seems like everything that could happen to test you did happen. I don’t have any explanation for that.”

GUARD WADE SMITH (Transcribed by Lance Jaramillo)

(on fans cheering Texans QB Matt Schaub being hurt) “I don’t think I’ve ever been as disappointed in our fans than at that moment and in one respect you have diehard, loyal fans that after we come off the field losing 38-13 are cheering us going in to the tunnel. But on the other respect you have the majority of fans cheering when a guy that’s given so much to the city as far as wins and losses. The bottom line is wins and losses. As far as in the community, giving back to the city, as far as representing an organization the way you want a quarterback to do, for them to cheer at that moment it was extremely disappointing. That’s all I’ve got to say about that. Extremely disappointing.”

(on how Texans QB Matt Schaub is doing after the game) “I haven’t really had a chance to talk to him, but I know Matt as a person, I know the guy he is and he’s resilient and if he can be ready to go he’ll be ready to go and he’ll be there to lead us as he has in the past.”

DEFENSIVE END JJ WATT (Transcribed by Ellie Pardee and Shelby Wells)

(on today’s game) “Very disappointed obviously. Everybody – offense, defense, special teams, all of us. Everyone can look themselves and find a way to get better. Everyone can find something they need to improve on. I think all of us are looking right now and seeing what we can do to get back on the right track.”

(on what has been going wrong the last few weeks) “We’ve struggled mightily. It’s all phases of the game, and like I said, we all need to take a look in the mirror.”

(on how to turn the team around) “The only way I know how to do it is to go to work, is to come in positive, which is obviously not the easiest thing to do when you’re going through a time like this. Go to work, harder than you’ve ever gone. Nobody enjoys this. I don’t know what kind of words I can say to make anybody feel better. All I can do is go to work.”



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(on standing behind Coach Kubiak) “Absolutely. There’s no reason that he should take all the blame. It’s a team game, and there’s no one player or one coach or one group that should take the blame. It’s everybody. It’s the entire team, every phase. We all need to find a way to be better. As players, we need to do every single thing we can to figure out what we can do to help this team win games, myself included.”

(fans reaction to Matt Schaub’s injury) “Yeah, it’s disappointing. You never ever want anybody to cheer an injury. That’s just unacceptable. I sure hope they don’t truly feel that way. That’s a pretty tough life if you’re cheering for somebody else to get injured. That’s a man with a wife and kids, that’s a man who’s given a lot of effort and a lot of work to this city. I sure hope there weren’t a lot of people cheering. I hope that was a very, very small minority.”

(on trouble in all three phases) “Yeah, we need to get a lot of things figured out. We need to obviously get a lot of different areas fixed, and things figured out and in a hurry. We need to do it in a real big hurry. So that’s what we’re going to do. Like I said, I could stand here and say all the things I want to say, but nobody wants to hear talk. Nobody wants to hear me say what we’re going to do. People want to see it. That’s all we can do. I mean, there are no words left. I just need to go out there and do it and prove it. Until that happens, everybody is going to be sick of talk.”

(on what he thinks the issue is) “That’s what we’re going to find out. I have been working hard. We’ve been putting in time, putting in effort. We need to figure it out. Whether it’s start from scratch. Whether it’s figure something new out, but we’ve got a week to do it. We need to figure something out and were going to do that.”

(on his emotions right now) “Right now, I would describe my emotions as frustrated. Frustrated. But like I said, as a player I have to be optimistic and as a leader of this team I have to be positive and that’s what I’m going to do. I’m going to come in to this week with a positive mentality, as hard as it may be and as difficult as it may sound, but I’ll motivate and lead and do what I can do to get this thing on the right track.”

(on if the season is slipping away) “I mean, you can’t lose four in a row and say that you’re putting yourself in the best position in the world. Are we writing anything off? No. you can’t write anything off. Do we need to start playing better, extremely quickly? Yeah, that’s exactly what we need to do.”

(on having talent on this team, but not getting the job done) “Obviously it’s frustrating when you know what you’re capable of and you know the expectations that you have for yourself and your team and you’re not living up to that right now. We need to find a way to do that quickly. If there’s something positive you can take out of that statement it’s that we have the guys to do it. We have the guys to dig out of a hole like this. We have what it takes. We just need to, like I said, we need to do it. I can say that all I want, but we need to do it. We need to prove it.”

(on if playoffs and the Super Bowl is still a possibility) “I mean, were not mathematically out of it, are we? I didn’t think so.”

QUARTERBACK T.J. YATES (Transcribed by Adrian Jones)

(on current situation of the Houston Texans) “I wish I could put a finger on it. We are all trying to figure it out right now. Bad things are happening. We are turning the ball over and not playing well. We moved the ball great out there. We had almost 400 yards of total offense. We have to score in the red zone. We have to not give them many chances to win. We can’t help any other team, we have to help ourselves. We are just not doing that right now.”

(on effort of the team when things are going their way) “Yeah, I think so. I don’t think there is any lack of effort across the board. People are still fighting hard. When you get in those holes it is tough to get out of them. We have to start doing things early to not get in those holes.”

(on the interception thrown to LB Alec Ogletree returned for a touchdown) “It is a tough situation right there. It’s fourth down and you come into the game down by 30, and everybody in the building knows we are going to pass the ball, especially (the Rams). You have to be smarter with the ball. I tried to force it in there a little bit, which is something you can’t do. I was just trying to make a play.”

(on if it is surprising to not see the team respond when down at home) “Yeah. Usually here we have a little bit of an extra spark, but it just wasn’t there today. Wherever that spark is, we have to find it, whether it is in ourselves



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or wherever. Each guy in this locker room has to dig deep and figure something out because what we are doing right now isn't cutting it."

(on fans cheering when QB Matt Schaub was injured) "Yeah, that is disrespectful. The guy is laying there on the ground holding his ankle, and the fans are cheering. For all that guy has done for this city and this team, for the fans to be booing him when he is hurt on the ground, straight up disrespectful."

(on Coach Gary Kubiak's message to team) "I haven't spoken to him yet. To the team, just the same thing I am saying. We have to figure this out. We all have to look deep down in ourselves, because we have to figure it out. We have to find it somewhere, because it is there. We know this team can play, we know this team has done it before. We just have to figure it out and get it done."

(on offensive struggles in the red zone) "That is something that we all trying to figure out. I don't think there is any one thing wrong. We are just not making the plays when we need to. We are making the plays to get down there; we are moving the play very, very well. It is just when we get down there we kind of stalling a little bit. Whether it is guys fighting for extra yards to put us in better situations, that was the name of the game. It took us out of the game early, not turning those threes into sevens."

HEAD COACH JEFF FISHER (Transcribed by Roman Petrowski)

(opening statement) “How is everybody? Anybody have any questions regarding what just happened? You know, we felt really good about the game plan. Obviously I have a great deal of respect for their offense and their defense since they’re ranked number one in the National Football League. But we knew we were going to have to have a hard time with the run game, and obviously that was evident in the first half. We did make some adjustments however, got things settled down. I’m just proud of our guys you know. They worked hard all week, had fun, felt like they had a chance to come in here and win. We knew we were going to need to make big plays, and it started with the turnover. We took advantage of the pass interference penalty. We got the ball in the end zone and you know it just fell into play for us. You know, everybody contributes. Special teams, you know, obviously we didn’t get to punt return many as far as punt returns are concerned, but I thought as a whole the special teams unit matched up and played pretty well and then offensively we got the run game going a little bit and then the big drive in the third quarter was a huge drive for us.”

(on what he told the team after the Jacksonville game how it feels to be 2-0) “They were chanting ‘2-0, 2-0’ when I came into the locker room. So, it was a long preseason but it’s behind us now.”

(on what was the biggest surprise of the game to him in reference to the Texans) “Well, I would say from our standpoint it was our ability to get turnovers. You know, that was a big thing. You know, and we did not turn the football over. We had a couple offensive penalties late, but you know keeping the penalties down and protecting the football and not turning it over for us has been very helpful for us the last two weeks. And keeping our quarterback upright for that matter.”

(on the running game and the efficiency of RB Zac Stacy) “Well it was. Again we ran the ball more times than we threw it, and it’s worked for us the last couple weeks. You know the offensive line obviously prefers that. They knew they were going to have a huge challenge on their hands. (Texans DE) J.J. (Watt) is an outstanding player as is (LB) Brian (Cushing) in the middle, and they’ve got a good group on defense. You know, for us to manage the game and pick up some key first downs and keep drives alive I thought that was good.”

(on controlling J.J. Watt) “Well I’ll have to look at the tape. Again, he’s an outstanding player. You know he’s hard to control, but we threw it quick. You know that was our, we didn’t want to hold it. You know, often times we try to set it to where we’re running away from him.”

(on missing on the deep ball early but being able to bounce back) “Yeah nobody was flustered. I think they (the Texans) maybe were caught a little bit by surprise that (WR) Chris (Givens) got behind them like that. It was a great throw and we just missed it. But we just hung in there and converted that third down and moved on.”

(on if he has a new secret weapon in the passing game with TE Corey Harkey) “Corey’s done a nice job for us. He’s blocking well. He’s one of the reasons all the tight ends are effective in our run game as far as on the line of scrimmage. When you’re running the football it’s often times favorable to sneak him out. Take advantage of it.”

(on what they did to cause the snowballing of the Houston Texans) “We came in with the lead. I was pleased that we were able to hold them to two field goals in the first half. We had 45 seconds left and he (Gary Kubiak) had his time outs so we elected to; I was okay with coming in up by 11. Then we just made some adjustments. Being able to get that ball back and get a stop on the first drive after the kickoff that went out of bounds I felt like was probably one of those turning points in the game for us.”



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(on the Rodney McLeod hit and the Daren Bates fumble recovery on the kickoff for a touchdown and if Bates injured himself diving into the end zone) “Bates is okay. I mean, he didn’t go back into the game but I don’t think he’s hurt seriously, but I don’t know when he hurt his hip. That’s a hard thing to do what we did on the kickoff cover team; score on the kickoff cover team. That’s really hard to do, but you know that’s one of the things that coach (John) Fassel talked about as long as they keep playing hard sometimes those good things are going to happen. Huge play for us.”

(on what he thought about Texans RB Arian Foster) “My opinion of him has never changed. He’s a really outstanding back. He’s a competitor and hates losing and you can tell the way he was running the football after we got a significant lead.”

(on what went through his head when the fans cheered Texans QB Matt Schaub’s injury) “Well, it’s disappointing from the standpoint that Matt’s won a lot of games here. The position that he plays in the National Football League is difficult to play at times, but he’s still an outstanding quarterback. As I’ve said all week, we weren’t concerned about the interceptions obviously that had taken place up to the point. I was more concerned about his potential to move the football and the weapons he has. Obviously they miss (TE) Owen (Daniels) I think. If he was healthy it may or may not have changed the outcome of this game, I don’t know, but Matt’s a competitor and he’s earned the right for people to respect him here in town.”

(on if it was a psychological thing or an x’s and o’s thing that helped get the team out of the whole they dug themselves into the last two weeks) “Well, it was a combination of things. We tweaked some things. We still have a long way to go x and o wise on defense. It was important to us to speak life into our team, you know after the Thursday game and I think we did that. We sent them off and gave them a little break and brought them back and just started over.”

(on if he has noticed any differences between the Texan’s offense this year as opposed to the last couple years) “No, it’s a very potent offense. It’s got playmakers and can run the football. It’s an outstanding offensive line. Nobody likes to play this run game because of the way they block and they’ve always been that way. Tough to defend.”

(on what it’s like for a team to hold them to field goals when they get in the red zone) “To get stops. You want to get stops. The game is managed differently in the second half. Especially after we got into the third quarter and fourth quarter. We were just bleeding the clock. That was what we were doing and then on top of that we were able to get the stops.”

DEFENSIVE TACKLE MICHAEL BROCKERS (Transcribed by Chris Burkhalter)

(on playing in front of a large contingent of family and friends) “The main thing is winning the game. It was great playing in front of my hometown crowd. It felt good.”

(on the defense letting loose and going after Texans quarterback Matt Schaub) “I think so, but a lot of it was trying to stop the run and making them (the Texans) one dimensional. We knew once we had the run under control a little bit, we could get to the passer, so that is what we were able to do.”

(on the speed of James Laurinaitis on fumble return) “I don’t know. I don’t think anybody expected him to be fast, but he got the turnover, and that’s all that counts. It gave our offense a chance to score points.”

(on momentum of the win) “It is momentum. I don’t think we can talk about the 24-hour rule (of enjoying a win). We have to keep going, keep focusing on the next team and keep the momentum going.”

CORNERBACK JANORIS JENKINS (Transcribed by Trevor Caswell)

(on QB Matt Schaub’s continued struggles) “We knew that he was struggling, but he’s a good quarterback. We just decided to come out here and take advantage of every play that we can on offense, defense and special teams.”

(on the fluidity of the St. Louis defense) “It all comes back to playing as a team. The defensive line has to work with the linebackers and the linebackers have to work with the secondary. We were hitting on all cylinders and we just have to keep improving.”



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(on the St. Louis' quick offensive start) "Any time your team is up, it gives you more things to do on the back end, like reading coverages and jumping routes because they are looking to throw the ball. We got them into the situation that we wanted them in; where they had to throw the ball and we came out successful."

LINEBACKER JAMES LAURINAITIS (Transcribed by ReShun Gilmore)

(on defensive execution) "We knew the key to this game was holding them out of the end zone and finding ways to get turnovers. We were able to get turnovers and that really helped us. We knew they were going to get yards and this offense has two really good backs. They are tough to defend. We just needed to find ways to keep them out of the end zone and get the ball back for our offense."

(on scoring defensive touchdowns and the potential of the defense) "When you can score defensive touchdowns, that's a game changer. Those don't come a whole lot. So, when you get them, that can change the whole outcome of the game. It's detrimental for them when you give them up. The special teams touchdown by LB (Darren) Bates and the pick six by LB Alec Ogletree were huge swings for this ball game."

DEFENSIVE END CHRIS LONG (Transcribed by ReShun Gilmore)

(on playing a complete game) "It was a lot of fun. That's why we come out and play football. Those losses really sucked. To come out here and play a pretty much complete game was fun. Offense and defense were in complete sync. Offense did a great job possessing and running the football. They were hitting on play action and QB Sam (Bradford) played a great game. We tightened up when we needed to in the red zone. We got some turnovers and that's the way we play."

(on seizing the moment) "Well, what was big for us was getting off the field on our first possession. For us to get off the field and get that first touchdown, that plays in our hand. So once we get rolling, we can rush the passer and we're pretty good at that. So, that's what we have to do. Hopefully, we can continue to follow that blueprint, but guys have to execute. We have to improve on stopping the run. They came out and gashed us in the first half and coach made great adjustments. We did a good job in the second half."

(on Arian Foster) "He was Arian Foster, one of the elite backs in the league. We have to be better. We'll go back and make those adjustments, but sometimes it's nice to not have your best day and go out and win the ballgame. That means we are doing a lot of things right. Takeaways can take care of a lot of things. You can't count on them every week, so that's why we have to improve on our run defense. We played a complete game."

LINEBACKER ALEC OGLETREE (Transcribed by Chris Burkhalter)

(on his interception for a touchdown in the third quarter) "I was able to read the quarterback's eyes, and I kind of stepped in front of the route they were running, and I was able to take it to the house. It was more of an instinct play for me, even though I did see it on film. I just know when they get down close (to the end zone) they want to run a few routes like that. So, when the time came I was able to step up and make a big play."

(on Rams defensive performance) "We played really well today. Guys stepped up and made plays all over the field. We were able to get a few turnovers, and like I said, we were able to come out with a win. I am definitely proud of the defense. We need to get back to practice to get better as a team, and this win is certainly a step in the right direction for us."

RUNNING BACK DARYL RICHARDSON (Transcribed by Chris Burkhalter)

(on his performance against the Texans) "I feel like I had a good performance. I always feel I can get better. The Texans have a very good defense, very physical and aggressive. We just executed today."

(on the game turning in the third quarter) "We just need to keep the momentum going and just stick together. We just needed to keep working hard as a team and never give up. That's what happened today. We took advantage of some turnovers, and we just held on to the ball ourselves. When you don't turn the ball over and your defense is getting turnovers, it is a good chance that you can win the game. That happened for us today."

RUNNING BACK ZAC STACY (Transcribed by ReShun Gilmore)

(on offensive execution) "We just went out and executed. There were no secrets or anything like that. We knew Houston has one of the best defenses in the league. The main thing for us was to just go out and execute and that's what we did."



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(on keeping a consistent winning mentality throughout the game) “Regardless of what point of the game, we wanted to keep the same mentality throughout all four quarters and the three phases of the game. Offense, special teams and defense were clicking. It just came down to execution and we did a great job of that.”

(on what this game means moving forward) “It’s just another game. We went out and got the job done. We got the win and right now we’re going to go out, focus on our next opponent and get back to the drawing board. We have to correct our mistakes and improve. There is always room for improvement and focus on the little things. We have to be consistent.”

CENTER SCOTT WELLS (Transcribed by Chris Burkhalter)

(on what they were looking to do in the game against Texans defense) “We were looking to run the ball effectively and be a two-dimensional team and protect our quarterback. We were able to do that today. We were able to come in here and be successful. We have to go back and critique the film, make the improvements and move on to the next opponent.”

(on the offensive mindset after the big third quarter) “Obviously, you want to continue to run the ball to eat up time and give the defense a break. There was a stretch (the defense) was out there a good portion of the second half. So, that is one area of the game we need to improve on because at the end of the game, we need to be able to go out there and run our four-minute offense to eat up the clock and run our offense. We did not do that part well at the end of the game.”

(on facing DE J.J. Watt and keeping him out of plays) “He is an outstanding player. I have a great amount of respect for him. As a team, we have to go out there and block him by using great fundamentals and technique and execute the game plan. If we are able to things like that, even with a player like Watt, we should have some success.”
