### TEXANS PLAY HOST TO SAN FRANCISCO

A pair of defending division champions from 2011 will be on display when the **Houston Texans (1-0)** open their 2012 home preseason slate against the **San Francisco 49ers (1-0)** on Saturday, Aug. 18 at Reliant Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. CT.

Houston dominated both sides of the ball the last time the two teams met, a 30-7 win at Candlestick Park in the third week of the 2011 pre-season. The Texans outgained the 49ers 417-105 in that game and didn't give up any points on defense. QB **Matt Schaub** threw for 180 yards on 16-of-24 passing with a touchdown and an interception, and FS **Troy Nolan** picked off two passes, returning one 73 yards for a score. San Francisco's only score came on **Ahmad Brooks'** 13-yard pick-six on the first play of the game. The game was a sign of things to come only for the Texans, who went on to win the 2011 AFC South division title. San Francisco went on to win the NFC West division title with a 13-3 record and advanced to the NFC title game where it lost to the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants, 20-17.

The Texans opened preseason play with a 26-13 win at Carolina last Saturday. Houston's defense racked up eight sacks and limited Carolina to 137 total yards, only 13 of which came after halftime. Rookie OLB **Whitney Mercilus** and ILB **Tim Dobbins** led the Texans with 1.5 sacks apiece, and the defense held the Panthers to four plays or less on eight of 12 possessions.

On offense, the Texans rushed for 174 yards and controlled the clock with 37:41 of possession. Schaub made his return from a foot injury that landed him on injured reserve last November and completed 3-of-6 passes for 52 yards and an interception in limited play. WR **Lestar Jean** led a young receiving corps with 50 yards receiving on two receptions. Rookie WR **Keshawn Martin** started in place of WR **Andre Johnson** and caught two passes for 24 yards and rushed for 12 more yards on an end-around. TE **Garrett Graham** led all receivers with three receptions for 44 yards. Rookie undrafted free agent RB **Jonathan Grimes** carried the ball nine times for 37 yards and scored the Texans' only offensive touchdown of the game on a 3-yard plunge in the third quarter.

Houston's special teams accounted for all but one score against the Panthers, with WR **Trindon Holliday** returning a first-quarter kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown. The kicking battle between rookie **Randy Bullock** and veteran **Shayne Graham** did not appear to shift in any direction after both notched a pair of field goals in their only attempts.

San Francisco opened preseason play with a 17-6 win against the Minnesota Vikings. The 49ers' run game accounted for 260 of the team's 412 yards of total offense. QB **Colin Kaepernick** led the team with 92 yards on the ground, including a 78-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

The teams last met in Week 7 of the 2009 season, with Houston earning a 24-21 win at Reliant Stadium. Houston leads the all-time preseason series 1-0.

The Houston Texans go to great lengths to create a one-of-a-kind game day experience for fans at Reliant Stadium. One of the ways that the team makes the experience unique is by unifying all of the pregame and in-game entertainment elements around a central

theme for each game.

This week's game theme is State of Football, a celebration of the football culture that is so deeply embedded in the Lone Star State that President John F. Kennedy used it to explain his goal of putting a man on the moon, saying "Some people ask, 'Why go to the moon?' They may well ask... 'Why does Rice play Texas?' We choose to go to the moon and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard."

## TEXANS 10th ANNIVERSARY LOGO



The Houston Texans will wear a patch adorned with the above logo to commemorate 10 years as an NFL franchise. Texans owner, founder and chief executive Bob McNair spearheaded the effort to bring professional football back to Houston.

The hard work paid off when the NFL awarded Houston its franchise on Oct. 6, 1999, and the Texans were born. Regular season play began with a 19-10 win against the Dallas Cowboys on Sept. 8, 2002, at Reliant Stadium.

## TEXANS HEAD COACH GARY KUBIAK



Gary Kubiak has constructed a talent-laden roster and installed an offensive system that has ranked among the NFL's best since taking the reins of the Houston Texans. Kubiak was named the AFC Coach of the Year by Kansas City-based NFL 101 after leading the Texans to a 10-6 regular season record and the franchise's first AFC South division crown, playoff berth and playoff win in 2011. He has a franchise-record 48 wins (including the playoffs) since being named the second head coach of the Houston Texans on Jan. 26, 2006.

The Houston native has led the Texans to the four best seasons in franchise history, going 8-8 in 2007 and 2008 before producing the first winning season in team history in 2009, narrowly missing the playoffs at 9-7. His tenure has been marked by offensive proficiency, producing the top five scoring, total offense and passing season marks in franchise history from 2007-11. The top two rushing seasons in franchise history have come on Kubiak's watch as well, including a franchise-record 153.0 yards per game in 2011, which ranked second in the NFL.

Four of the Texans' top five defensive seasons have come under Kubiak, including the third-largest defensive turnaround in NFL history from 2010 to 2011. The 2011 Texans gave up 285.7 yards per game to rank second in the League after giving up 376.9 yards per game and ranking 30th in 2010.

Strong team performances on offense and defense have been sparked by some outstanding individual efforts under Kubiak. Seventeen of the 21 Pro Bowl elections in team history have come during Kubiak's tenure, and the Texans are the only team in the NFL to produce a rushing, receiving and passing yardage champion since Kubiak became head coach.

One of Kubiak's primary goals upon arriving in Houston was to create a home field advantage at Reliant Stadium, and he has made significant strides in that direction. The Texans have posted a 30-19 (.612) home record since 2006 and have had at least a .500 record at home in each of Kubiak's six seasons. The team was 10-22 (.315) at home prior to Kubiak's arrival.

Kubiak spent 20 of the previous 23 years in the Denver area, where he earned a reputation as a brilliant offensive strategist. He played in 119 games and tossed 14 touchdowns for the Broncos from 1983-91 as the backup for Hall of Fame quarterback John Elway. He was a part of three teams that reached the Super Bowl.

In his 11 years as offensive coordinator in Denver, Kubiak's Broncos amassed 66,501 total yards and 465 touchdowns, the most in the NFL in that span. He coached 14 different Broncos who made the Pro Bowl, and Denver's rushing attack totaled 25,022 yards, most in the NFL, during his tenure.

## 49ERS HEAD COACH JIM HARBAUGH



Jim Harbaugh enters his second season as head coach after leading the 49ers to a 13-3 regular season record, its best since 1997, and a NFC West Division title, its first since 2002, last year. The consensus NFL Coach of the Year also led his squad to its first appearance in the NFC Championship game since 1998.

Known to routinely deflect all credit for success to his players, Harbaugh had a great deal to be proud of in 2011. San Francisco boasted a league-high five First-Team Associated Press All-Pros - DT Justin Smith, LB Patrick Willis, LB NaVorro Bowman, K David Akers and P Andy Lee (Justin Smith as a DE, LT Joe Staley and CB Carlos Rogers were named to the Second Team). The 49ers also posted a NFL-high nine Pro Bowl selections - Smith, Willis, Akers, Lee, Rogers, Staley, S Dashon Goldson, RB Frank Gore, and LS Brian Jennings.

Harbaugh joined the 49ers after a four-year stint as the head coach at Stanford University, composing the biggest turnaround in school history over a four-year span (2007-10). He posted a 20-6 record over the last two seasons, which included a historic 12-1 season (2010) that was punctuated by an Orange Bowl win in the first Bowl Championship Series bowl appearance in school history. Harbaugh orchestrated two of the highest scoring teams in school history, three of the top four rushing teams in program history and back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time since 1995 and '96.

Along his coaching trail, Harbaugh served stints as the head coach at the University of San Diego (2004-06) and as an offensive assistant with the Oakland Raiders (2002-03).

As a first round draft pick by the Chicago Bears in 1987, Harbaugh played for five teams over 15 seasons and ranks in the NFL's top-50 in two career passing categories - completions (41st) and pass attempts (45th). As a player, he helped lead the University of Michigan to two bowl appearances, garnering Big Ten Player of the Year honors.

## GAME 7: Houston 24, San Francisco 21

### GAME SUMMARY

The Texans showed the resolve of a veteran team by shutting down the San Francisco 49ers' comeback attempt in a 24-21 win at Reliant Stadium.

After a nearly flawless first half, the Texans saw their 21-0 halftime lead whittled to three points in the fourth quarter. But on the 49ers' potential game-winning drive, S Eugene Wilson picked off QB Alex Smith with 36 seconds on the game clock to preserve Houston's fourth win of the season.

The Texans' defense limited the 49ers to only 50 total net yards of offense in the first half, but San Francisco responded behind Smith, who replaced starter Shaun Hill in the third quarter. Smith finished with 206 passing yards and three touchdowns to TE Vernon Davis.

Offensively, the Texans struggled to establish a consistent ground game, but QB Matt Schaub continued his excellent play by completing 20-of-30 passes for 264 yards with two touchdowns. Pro Bowl TE Owen Daniels, who caught seven passes for a game-high 123 yards and a touchdown. RB Steve Slaton chipped in with four catches for 22 yards and a touchdown, while gaining 67 yards on 18 carries with a score.

Slaton opened the scoring with a 1-yard touchdown run on Houston's third drive of the game. The Texans went up 14-0 following a muffed punt by 49ers WR Arnaz Battle at the 10-yard line. Houston WR André Davis recovered the fumble. Two plays later, Slaton caught a screen pass and avoided two defenders to score a 9-yard touchdown.

Schaub pushed the lead to 21-0 before halftime when he connected with Daniels on a perfectly executed play action fake for a 42-yard touchdown.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, Smith put San Francisco on the scoreboard with a 29-yard touchdown pass to Davis. The 49ers then converted a Slaton fumble into a 66-yard scoring drive that ended with Davis' 14-yard TD reception to cut the deficit to seven points.

Kris Brown answered with a 50-yard field goal making the score 24-14 with 7:16 left in the game.

In response, Smith led the 49ers 73 yards on seven plays over 3:33 and completed a 23-yard touchdown pass to Davis with 3:43 left in the game to complete the scoring.

#### GAME SUMMARY

Sparked by kick returner **Trindon Holliday** and a dominant defense, the Texans cruised to a 26-13 victory in their preseason opener against the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium.

The Texans' starters played three series apiece on both sides of the ball, building a 10-3 lead that turned into a 26-13 victory. Holliday had a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter, and the Texans' defense, led by 1.5 sacks from rookie first-round draft pick **Whitney Mercilus**, totaled eight sacks and limited the Panthers to 137 yards, including 13 in the second half.

Texans QB **Matt Schaub** completed 3-of-6 passes for 52 yards with one interception in his first game since suffering a Lisfranc injury on Nov. 7. WR **Andre Johnson** did not play because of a groin injury. Rookie **Keshawn Martin** started in his place and had two catches for 24 yards and one carry for 12 yards on an end around.

The Texans' defense forced reigning NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year **Cam Newton** and the Panthers to a three-and-out on both of their first two series. CB **Kareem Jackson** broke up a pass on third down to end the first drive. OLB **Brooks Reed** sacked Newton for a 10-yard loss on the second.

Schaub led a nine-play, 65-yard scoring drive on the Texans' first series. He was 3-of-4 for 52 yards, putting the Texans in position for a 20-yard field goal by **Shayne Graham**.

RB **Arian Foster's** only carry of the night came on the Texans' next series. He gained 11 yards before losing a fumble at midfield, which led to a 35-yard field goal by Carolina's **Olindo Mare**.

Holliday returned the ensuing kickoff for a touchdown, darting through a seam on the right side and bolting to the end zone. Schaub was hit as he threw and picked off by Panthers LB **Jason Phillips** over the middle two plays into the Texans' next series.

**T.J. Yates** relieved Schaub late in the first quarter. The second-year quarterback was sharp, completing 8-of-12 passes for 89 yards. He led two scoring drives that ended in field goals, which were sandwiched around a 1-yard touchdown run by Panthers RB **Tauren Poole**.

The Texans' defense limited the Panthers to two first downs in the second half. They also had five sacks and two takeaways, a third-quarter interception by S **Troy Nolan** and fourth-quarter fumble recovery by rookie NT **Hebron Fangupo**.

Mercilus and ILB **Tim Dobbins** both had 1.5 sacks on the night. Reed and OLB **Jesse Nading**, **Bryan Braman** and **D.J. Bryant** each had one sack.

Undrafted rookie RB **Jonathan Grimes** ran for a 3-yard touchdown in the third quarter to give the Texans a 23-13 lead. It capped an 11-play, 61-yard drive led by QB **John Beck**, who went 4-of-6 for 46 yards in his Texans debut.

Texans rookie QB **Case Keenum** made his NFL debut in the fourth quarter and was 2-of-3 for 33 yards with four carries for eight yards.

Rookie K **Randy Bullock** closed out the scoring with a 52-yard field goal with 1:57 remaining in the game.

- The Texans dominated time of possession, holding the ball for 37:41.
- The Texans' starting defense forced a three-and-out in each of their first two series of the preseason, holding the Panthers offense to one yard of net offense on the two drives.
- The Texans defense recorded two takeaways, an interception and a fumble recovery. The two takeaways along with a fumble and an interception by the offense gave Houston an even turnover margin in the game.
- The Texans defense registered eight total sacks, with six different players accounting for them.
- The Texans' starting offense drove 65 yards in nine plays for a field goal on its first possession of the preseason, capping the drive with a 20-yard field goal from K Shayne Graham.
- The Texans rushed for 174 yards in the game, marking the fourth time in three years under offensive coordinator **Rick Dennison** that the Texans have rushed for more than 170 yards in a preseason game.
- The Texans led 10-3 at the end of the first quarter, were tied at half-time, 13-13, and led after three quarters 23-13.
- The Panthers won the toss and elected to receive the opening kickoff.

## INDIVIDUAL PLAYER NOTES

- QB **John Beck** finished 4-of-6 for 46 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions, giving him a passer rating of 89.6. Beck engineered the Texans' only touchdown drive of the night, an 11-play, 61-yard march in the third quarter.
- OLB **Bryan Braman** sacked Carolina QB Jimmy Clausen for 5-yard loss early in the fourth quarter. It was his first sack in the preseason and the defense's fifth of the night.
- K **Randy Bullock** capped the Texans' scoring with a 52-yard field goal in the fourth quarter following the two-minute warning. Bullock was

2-of-2 on the night with the 52-yarder and a 21-yarder in the second quarter.

- ILB **Tim Dobbins** sacked Carolina QB Derek Anderson for a 7-yard loss in the second quarter. It was Houston's third sack of the first half.
- Dobbins teamed with OLB **Whitney Mercilus** to sack Carolina QB Jimmy Clausen for a 9-yard loss in the third quarter. The sack gave each of them 1.5 for the game.
- K **Shayne Graham** converted both of his field goal attempts, hitting from 20 yards in the first quarter and from 37 yards in the third quarter.
- RB **Jonathan Grimes** scored the Texans' first offensive touchdown of the preseason on a 3-yard run in the third quarter. The score came as the result of an interception and capped an 11-play, 61-yard drive.
- WR **Trindon Holliday** returned a first-quarter kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown. It was the second kickoff return for a score in team preseason history. WR Reggie Swinton had a 102-yard return for touchdown in 2005 at Dallas (8/27/05). Holliday finished the game with 182 total return yards, including 159 in kickoff returns.
- OLB **Whitney Mercilus** registered the first sack of his career when he dropped Carolina QB Derek Anderson for a 4-yard loss in the second quarter.
- Mercilus teamed with ILB **Tim Dobbins** to sack Carolina QB Jimmy Clausen for a 9-yard loss in the third quarter. The sack gave each of them 1.5 for the game.
- OLB **Jesse Nading** sacked Carolina QB Jimmy Clausen for a 5-yard loss in the fourth quarter. It was the sixth sack of the night for the Texans defense.
- FS **Troy Nolan** intercepted a pass on Carolina's opening drive of the third quarter, setting up an eventual touchdown. It was his fourth career interception in preseason play after he had two picks in the 2011 preseason and one in the 2010 preseason.
- OLB **Brooks Reed** registered a sack for a 10-yard loss on Houston's second defensive series.
- QB **Matt Schaub** finished the night 3-of-6 for 52 yards with no touchdowns and one interception. He led three drives: a 9-play, 65-yard scoring drive; a 1-play, 11-yard drive that ended with a fumble; and a 2-play, 12-yard drive that ended with an interception.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 12, 2012

**(on NT Shaun Cody's back injury)** "He's got a disc issue. We're really still in an evaluation process. He received an epidural today and we're going to see how he reacts to that, so I think it's going to be a couple days before we really know exactly what we're looking at, but obviously he's going to miss some time here this week."

**(on if he feels comfortable with the two guys stepping in during NT Shaun Cody's absence)** "Yeah, Sunny (NT Ra'Shon Harris) has been out. We've missed Sunny so we're hoping to get him back tomorrow. Earl (Mitchell) has played well, and then Lonnie (NT Hebron Fangupo), our young guy that we got from BYU, made some plays last night. We like those guys but at the same time we are kind of beat up on the defensive line just in general, and we got a good two more weeks of so-called training camp to continue to battle through. It could be an issue so it's something we'll have to work through."

**(on the right side of the offensive line in the first preseason game)** "I think that (T Rashad) Butler and (G Antoine) Caldwell played like they were more veterans than the other two, which you would expect, but I think they all did some good things. The young kid (G Brandon Brooks) came in and I thought he did some good things, especially in pass-pro (protection). I thought (T Derek) Newton was a little inconsistent but continues to flash. It's going to be a good battle. We played those guys probably more than any of our older players last night and that will be on a continuous basis over the next couple weeks. I think they kind of played the way I expected them to play."

**(on the return game outside of WR Trindon Holliday's touchdown return)** "It's ahead of our coverage game. I would say that. I think we've been doing some good stuff from that standpoint. We're much better with our upfront guys in our kick return. We've got some veteran special teams players when you talk about (Jesse) Nading and (Bryan) Braman and (Tim) Dobbins. They've been playing together for a while. But Trindon did do some nice things on his own, too. As I said last night, the big return was nice, but the thing I liked is that the other ones were positive too. There are some things he can improve on. I didn't think he should have fair caught that one. I think he should go ahead and try to make a play there. But it was a big step for him in the right direction."

**(on incorporating WR Trindon Holliday into the offense more)** "I don't know if he played any offensively last night, but the biggest thing we're going to do is we're going to give him a chance to be our all-time returner. That's what we're trying to give him chance to do. Yes, he's come a long way offensively as far as knowing what we're doing. The thing he's caught up in right now is my evaluation with him is going to be a big priority on special teams, because I've got the issue with all the other young receivers, trying to get (DeVier) Posey along, and (Keshawn) Martin along, and Lestar (Jean). We've got such a battle going on there from that standpoint. Reps are kind of at a premium right now so that was kind of on me."

**(on the excitement WR Keshawn Martin brings)** "Y'all can see him. He has tremendous speed. He outran a couple guys right there and found a way to make a 10 or 11 yard gain, where it might be a 5-yard loss. He's a very talented young man. I thought he held himself together pretty good. (He) had some mistakes, some consistency stuff, but for a guy to be here two weeks and start at receiver in his first preseason game, I thought he did a pretty good job."

**(on RB Jonathan Grimes' performance in the first preseason game)** "I've been impressed with him the whole time. Y'all know that. Not only

played well offensively but played well on special teams. He and (RB Davin) Meggett both showed up well for Joe (Marciano) on special teams. He's a very reliable, sharp young man, handles himself like he's been around for a couple years and it showed on the field last night."

**(on if the two red zone trips that resulted in two field goals were because of rustiness or due to a lack of execution)** "I would attribute it to bad execution. I thought we had some opportunities to make some plays. I thought we didn't execute one time at the quarterback, another time at the receiver. The field gets smaller down there and you got to make little plays. That's something we've been working on in practice. The key to us in the red zone is running the ball well, so overall if we play better in the red zone last night, there's a lot more points. Getting down there was a good thing, but it was a negative as far as what we did offensively."

**(on who will be back this week)** "I'm hoping we get Sunny (Ra'Shon Harris) back tomorrow. I'm going to know more this evening. (DE Jared) Crick should be back tomorrow. (Jerrell) Jackson, our receiver, we got a chance of getting him back, and Bryant Johnson getting back. Tomorrow might be a little early but I think by Tuesday we got a chance of having all those guys back."

**(on if there was a particular unit he was most impressed with in the first preseason game)** "No. First of all, I just liked our conditioning. I thought our football team showed very good conditioning throughout the course of the game. I thought we held up well. I thought each area we had some very positive things going on. Defensively, you get to the quarterback eight or nine times. That was exceptional but I hate to pinpoint exactly one thing. It would be hard to do. There were a lot of good things going on."

**(on RB Arian Foster fumbling the ball and if ball security is a concern)** "Arian (Foster) knows he's got to hang onto the ball. I don't have to tell him that. I do tell him on regular basis but he knows that. I normally would have went right back to him and handed it to him again, but I had a play count on all of our ones and regardless of what happened, I was going to stick to it. He'll get his work. We'll pick up his work this week."

**(on RB Justin Forsett's play)** "Pretty consistent. He's played a lot in this league so it's not too big for him and he understands what we're doing. I thought he did some good stuff. He made some really nice runs a couple times when we didn't block very well. Covering kicks for Joe (Marciano) will be a big part of him being a part of this team, so he did that as well."

**(on the running backs competition)** "I think there's a great competition going on at three, four and five and all for our third spot. All those guys have shown good things and they've all shown that they'll be able to help Joe (Marciano), so that kind of puts them all on equal footing as we move forward. Arian (Foster) and Ben (Tate), obviously I have to pick their work load this week and make sure they get carries as we proceed to week one."

**(on an overview of the quarterbacks)** "I thought it was pretty good. I liked what I saw from Matt (Schaub). I thought he was sharp. It had been a while since he'd been in the pocket. Other than the turnover which we caught a corner fire, a blitz that we did not pick up, but he's got to protect the ball right there. But I thought he looked like himself. I think T.J. (Yates) is growing as a player, getting better and better. John Beck handled himself really well. And then I think Case (Keenum) did

a good job; he's working with our young offensive line. We had some breakdowns up front, but he found a way to keep things positive and move the football. So I'll give him some more this week, but I thought all four of them did some pretty good things."

**(on if WR Andre Jonson and ILB Brian Cushing will play)** "Yeah, I didn't mention Cush (Brian Cushing). Cush should be on the field in the morning. He's doing great, he's feeling really good. Y'all know we left him at home and he's had a good weekend, so he's back to himself. Andre (Johnson), it's early. It's Sunday, but yeah, he should play. If everything goes according to schedule, he should play this week. He could have played in the game, but he was behind everybody else practice time-wise, so it didn't make a lot of sense to me. He did get a good workout yesterday. We'll continue to push him forward. I expect him to get his reps this weekend. Is it as many as the ones we'll play? I don't know, we'll see."

**(on TE Garrett Graham)** "Well, he's a very much-improved player, and we've seen that the last two weeks; it didn't just happen last night. He's come a long way. He's bigger, stronger, he's faster. He's had a great offseason with (strength and conditioning coach) Cedric (Smith). Cedric really did a heck of a job with him. And if he continues to step the way he has in his first few weeks, it's going to be a really nice year for him. I've been very impressed with his play."

**(on WR Lestar Jean)** "Did some really good stuff. Needs to get consistent because he has a chance to be a heck of a player. But made some tough catches last night for us, did a pretty good job in the running game, made a couple tackles on special teams but needs to continue to get consistent with what he's doing because he has a chance to be a big-time player in this league, not just a good player. So we're going to push him, trying to find that next level."

**(on areas that need improvement with the defense)** "Just penalties, really. The guy we played so well, and the one touchdown drive we gave up, I think there was three big pass interference penalties or holding penalties. So as I told them after the game, we play a lot of man-coverage so we've got to be disciplined in our approach and how we do things. But overall defensively, you give up 160 yards in any football game, you're playing darn well. And the way we got to the quarterback, there were a lot of people getting to the quarterback. That was impressive."

**(on which were the most concerning penalties)** "I would just say overall just penalties in general. We had our share. We jumped off sides on special teams, we were off sides on a kickoff one time, just things that are discipline that you can't have in a game. So we had our share, and we'll have to go back and fix those tomorrow."

**(on the kicking competition)** "I think maybe Shayne (Graham) kicked off a little bit better than our young buck (Randy Bullock), but I think they both kicked well. I was very impressed with Randy, the last field goal. I don't know that I'm kicking that field goal in a regular season game right there in that situation in the game, but we wanted to give him a chance. Boy, he put it in the net from what, 52 or 53 (yards)? He's been impressive, but Shayne (Graham)'s having a good camp too, so it's going to be a good competition."

**(on what he thought about the replacement officials)** "Like I said last night, I've got so many things to worry about myself. I know they're working hard and trying to get ready for the season themselves. My concentration has got to be on fixing penalties, so that's what I'll try to do with our team."

**(on FS Troy Nolan's interception)** "Yeah, that's just finishing plays. We talk all the time to our players about finishing plays. Troy played to the whistle right there and was able to get that ball out. Troy has a knack for coming up with fumbles, interceptions, he has a way of getting his hands on the ball and last night was no exception. "

**(on if WR DeVier Posey was targeted at all in Carolina and the plan for him for the preseason)** "He had one that I can think of where (QB) Case (Keenum) missed him on a curl route. I actually told him last night, I said 'Hey, I know you didn't get a chance to touch the ball like some of the other guys, but you'll get your opportunities.' He worked well. He worked well in the game, he played a little special teams. The thing I want to see him do better, and I told him this, I told (wide receivers coach) Larry (Kirksey) this, when he makes mistakes, we need to correct them where they don't come up again. I think a lot of that has to do with missed time last year in college. But the ability is there and us getting him consistent in what we're doing, he's going to be able to help us so we got to get him consistent."

**(on what he's planning to do differently against San Francisco)** "We'll really pick up our reps. (RB) Arian (Foster) has got to get his touches, start to get his touches and get ready for the season. Obviously, we just won last night, very physical football team. We'll play our one's at least a quarter-and-a-half as we move forward. It will be a good test for us. I just got through watching the film of them against Minnesota; they look very good."

**(on what he felt about the players who started in place of injured starters)** "They did a heck of a job. (ILB) Mister (Alexander) gets his first start as a pro, and we played well defensively so Mister's out there doing his job. I think (ILB Tim) Dobbins is a much-improved player, kind of like Garrett Graham that we talked about. Dobbins had a great camp and played very well last night. (DE) Timmy Jamison jumps at me, he's had a lot of reps because of (DE) J.J. (Watt) being out, played very well in the game. Defensively as a whole, we played hard, and we were very productive. "

**(on how he would characterize the Carolina game: good, bad, or ugly?)** "There was some ugly. I should have brought you up to watch the film with me, there was some ugly. When you play a lot of people, you're trying to find some consistency in what you're doing. The thing I worry about in the first game, I tell the guys all the time, 'Hey you're going to make mistakes, let them go. But I want to see you play hard. I want to see you give effort.' We gave great effort in the game, so I'm very pleased with that. There are a lot of things for us to move forward on but at the same time, there are a lot of things we can't do if we're going to win in Week 1, and we're smart enough to know that."

# EXECUTIVE VP & GM RICK SMITH/COACHING STAFF

## GENERAL MANAGER AND EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT RICK SMITH



Rick Smith is in his seventh season as Texans general manager and second as executive vice president of football operations, overseeing all aspects of football operations. Smith inherited a two-win team when he was named general manager on June 5, 2006 and has since worked closely with the coaching and scouting staffs to build the Texans into a playoff team by identifying and signing elite players who have helped produce an exciting brand of football.

Smith has steadily strengthened Houston's roster through the draft, free agency and trades. His main philosophy has been to build through the draft and supplement via free agency with a thorough and innovative front office staff that has the Texans pointed toward sustained success.

Smith has also been active in league affairs while at the helm of the Texans. He was appointed to the NFL's prestigious Competition Committee by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell on Dec. 5, 2008, and was an original member of the General Managers Advisory Committee, which provides advice and other feedback to the NFL Football Operations department on the integrity of the game, expansion of technology and other ways to improve the game. In addition, Smith has earned recognition from his peers and was honored with the Tank Younger Award in 2008, presented annually by the Fritz Pollard Alliance for outstanding work in an NFL front office.

Smith has orchestrated several trades that have benefited the Texans greatly, including a deal with Atlanta in 2007 that brought quarterback Matt Schaub to Houston. Since then, Schaub has become the Texans' all-time leading passer, the 12th player in NFL history to throw for more than 4,000 yards in back-to-back seasons (2009-10), led the NFL in passing in 2009 with 4,770 yards, was named the 2010 Pro Bowl MVP and has helped lead Houston's offense to a top-four NFL ranking each year from 2008-10. In 2008, Smith traded with Denver for center Chris Myers, who became the first lineman in Texans history to make the Pro Bowl.

Perhaps the best overall draft class of Smith's tenure came in 2009, when the Texans drafted Brian Cushing with the 15th overall pick. The former USC linebacker went on to earn NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and Pro Bowl honors, and led the team in tackles in 2011 for the second time in three years. Smith also signed running back Arian Foster as an undrafted rookie free agent in 2009. Foster had a breakout year in 2010, leading the NFL with 2,220 yards from scrimmage, 20 touchdowns scored and 1,616 yards rushing, the most ever by an undrafted player, in addition to earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors.

In his former role with the Denver Broncos, Smith was responsible for evaluating players from around the NFL as well as those in NFL Europe, the Canadian Football League, the Arena Football League and other professional leagues. He also played a central role in the club's preparation for the college draft and was one of the Broncos' primary negotiators for player contracts.

With Smith heading the pro personnel department, the Broncos posted the league's fifth-best regular-season record from 2000-05, going 61-35 (.635). The 61 wins were the most of any AFC West team during that span, 10 more than the next closest team, Kansas City. Denver was one of only four teams in the NFL to reach the playoffs each season from 2003-05.

## A LOOK BACK AT 2011

### THE TEXANS

- Won the AFC South for the first time in team history and earned the franchise's first playoff berth.
- Won the franchise's first playoff game in their postseason debut, defeating Cincinnati 31-10 in the AFC Wild Card game in front of a Reliant Stadium record crowd of 71,725 on Jan. 7, 2012.
- Set franchise records with 10 regular season wins and a seven-game winning streak from 10/23-12/11.
- Matched the best road record in team history, going 5-3 and tying the mark set in 2009.
- Matched the best intra-division record in team history, going 4-2.
- Became the first team to win three consecutive games with three different starting quarterbacks since Tennessee did so in 2003.
- Sold out their 101st consecutive home game (including preseason and postseason) in franchise history in the playoffs against Cincinnati.

### THE TEXANS DEFENSE

- Posted the third-largest defensive improvement since 1970, allowing 91.2 fewer yards per game than in 2010. The 1997-98 Oakland Raiders (97.9) and 1976-77 Atlanta Falcons (95.4) are the only teams with larger improvements.
- Ranked second in the NFL in total defense, giving up an average of 285.7 yards per game, a franchise record-low.
- Became the ninth defense since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to hold three consecutive opponents to less than 175 yards of total offense, doing so at Tennessee in Week 7, vs. Jacksonville in Week 8 and vs. Cleveland in Week 9.
- Held 11 opponents to less than 20 points and went 10-1 in those games.
- Ranked fourth in the NFL and set a franchise record for fewest points allowed with 278.
- Registered a franchise-record 44.0 sacks and tied the team single-game record with 7.0 sacks in Week 12 at Jacksonville.

### THE TEXANS OFFENSE

- Led the NFL in average time of possession at 32:41 and won the time of possession battle 12 times.
- Set franchise records for rushing yards (2,448) and rushing attempts (546) in a season.
- Finished second in the NFL in rushing offense, averaging 153.0 yards per game.
- Had two players rush for more than 900 yards for the first time in team history (Arian Foster, 1,224; Ben Tate, 942).
- Set the franchise record for fewest interceptions thrown with nine.
- Scored on their opening drive of the game nine times and the opening drive of the second half 10 times.
- Had two players surpass 100 receiving yards in the same game twice - in Week 3 at New Orleans (Andre Johnson, 128; James Casey, 126) and Week 5 vs. Oakland (Arian Foster, 116; Joel Dreessen, 112).
- Had two players surpass 100 rushing yards in the same game twice - in Week 7 at Tennessee (Arian Foster, 115; Ben Tate, 104) and Week 9 vs. Cleveland (Foster, 124; Tate, 115), becoming the sixth team since 1985 to have a pair of 100-yard rushers twice in a season.

- Ran for the most yards ever by a player in his first two career playoff games, 285 (153 vs. Cincinnati and 132 at Baltimore).
- Joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Walter Payton (1983) as the only running backs to have two 70-plus-yard touchdown catches in a season since 1970. Foster had 78-yard touchdown receptions in Week 7 at Tennessee and Week 10 at Tampa Bay.
- Became the fifth man in NFL history to post back-to-back seasons with more than 1,000 rushing yards and 600 receiving yards.
- Earned AFC Offensive Player of the Month accolades in October. His 809 yards from scrimmage were the third-most in the month of October in the history of the NFL, trailing only Larry Brown's 851 yards for Washington in 1972 and Eric Dickerson's 829 yards for the Los Angeles Rams in 1983.
- Named AFC Offensive Player of the Week for Week 4 when he carried 30 times for 155 yards and the game-winning touchdown against a Pittsburgh defense that finished No. 1 in the NFL. **CONTINUED...**
