TEXANS FACE OFF AGAINST SAINTS ON NATIONAL TV

The Houston Texans (2-0) will give their starters their last significant playing time of the 2012 preseason when they take on the New Orleans Saints (1-2) at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Saturday, August 25. The game will be televised nationally on CBS and kicks off at 7 p.m.

Texans Head Coach Gary Kubiak told the Houston media Sunday that he expects to play his starters through the third quarter in their final tune-up before the Sept. 9 regular season opener against the Miami Dolphins. Houston's first string looked good on both sides of the ball in a 20-9 win against San Francisco last Saturday at Reliant Stadium. QB Matt Schaub finished with a 128.6 passer rating after completing 11-of-14 pass attempts for 128 yards and a 9-yard touchdown pass to WR Lestar Jean. The Texans' defense held the 49ers without a touchdown and recorded two more sacks to run their preseason total to 10 in two games.

The Texans' special teams garnered the most attention in the win against the 49ers. WR Trindon Holliday made a strong case for a spot on the final 53-man roster with his second return touchdown of the preseason. The third-year speedster took a fourth-quarter punt 87 yards for a score against San Francisco, adding to the 90-yard kickoff return he scored on in the preseason opener at Carolina. Houston's place-kicking battle continued in the game as veteran K Shayne Graham banged home 48- and 49-yard attempts against the 49ers while rookie K Randy Bullock pushed his 51-yard attempt wide right.

Saturday's matchup will feature the NFL's top two combined yardage leaders of the preseason in Holliday and Saints RB Travaris Cadet. Holliday ranks second in the NFL in kickoff return yards (220) and punt return yards (129) through two games for 349 combined yards. The rookie from Appalachian State leads the NFL with 368 combined yards, 19 receptions and 171 receiving yards this preseason.

Saturday's game will also be the final contest before the NFL's first roster cuts, which designate that all rosters have to be at 75 by 4 p.m. EDT on Monday, August 27.

Houston and New Orleans have met in each of the last four preseasons, splitting those contests. The Texans and Saints met in Week 3 of the regular season with New Orleans claiming a 40-33 decision the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. WR Andre Johnson and FB James Casey both had more than 125 yards receiving in the see-saw shootout. New Orleans outscored Houston 23-14 in the fourth quarter to overcome a 19-17 deficit and hand the Texans their first loss of the 2011 season. Schaub threw for 372 yards and three scores, while Saints QB Drew Brees totaled 370 yards passing and two touchdown passes.

The Texans hold a 3-2 advantage in the all-time preseason series with the Saints but trail 2-1 in the regular season series.

TEXANS 10th ANNIVERSARY LOGO



The Houston Texans will wear a patch adorned with the above logo to commemorate 10 years as an NFL franchise. Texans owner, founder and chief executive Bob McNair spearheaded the effort to bring professional football back to Houston.

The hard work paid off when the NFL awarded Houston its franchise on Oct. 6, 1999, and the Texans were born. Regular season play began with a 19-10 win against the Dallas Cowboys on Sept. 8, 2002, at Reliant Stadium.

TEXANS HEAD COACH GARY KUBIAK



Gary Kubiak has constructed a talent-laden roster and installed an offensive system that has ranked among the NFL's best since taking the reins of the Houston Texans. Kubiak was named the AFC Coach of the Year by Kansas City-based NFL 101 after leading the Texans to a 10-6 regular season record and the franchise's first AFC South division crown, playoff berth and playoff win in 2011. He has a franchise-record 48 wins (including the playoffs) since being named the second head coach of the Houston Texans on Jan. 26, 2006.

The Houston native has led the Texans to the four best seasons in franchise history, going 8-8 in 2007 and 2008 before producing the first winning season in team history in 2009, narrowly missing the playoffs at 9-7. His tenure has been marked by offensive proficiency, producing the top five scoring, total offense and passing season marks in franchise history from 2007-11. The top two rushing seasons in franchise history have come on Kubiak's watch as well, including a franchise-record 153.0 yards per game in 2011, which ranked second in the NFL.

Four of the Texans' top five defensive seasons have come under Kubiak, including the third-largest defensive turnaround in NFL history from 2010 to 2011. The 2011 Texans gave up 285.7 yards per game to rank second in the League after giving up 376.9 yards per game and ranking 30th in 2010.

Strong team performances on offense and defense have been sparked by some outstanding individual efforts under Kubiak. Seventeen of the 21 Pro Bowl elections in team history have come during Kubiak's tenure, and the Texans are the only team in the NFL to produce a rushing, receiving and passing yardage champion since Kubiak became head coach.

One of Kubiak's primary goals upon arriving in Houston was to create a home field advantage at Reliant Stadium, and he has made significant strides in that direction. The Texans have posted a 30-19 (.612) home record since 2006 and have had at least a .500 record at home in each of Kubiak's six seasons. The team was 10-22 (.315) at home prior to Kubiak's arrival.

Kubiak spent 20 of the previous 23 years in the Denver area, where he earned a reputation as a brilliant offensive strategist. He played in 119 games and tossed 14 touchdowns for the Broncos from 1983-91 as the backup for Hall of Fame quarterback John Elway. He was a part of three teams that reached the Super Bowl.

In his 11 years as offensive coordinator in Denver, Kubiak's Broncos amassed 66,501 total yards and 465 touchdowns, the most in the NFL in that span. He coached 14 different Broncos who made the Pro Bowl, and Denver's rushing attack totaled 25,022 yards, most in the NFL, during his tenure.

SAINTS ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/LINEBACKERS JOE VITT



Assistant Head Coach/Linebackers Joe Vitt is in his seventh season in New Orleans and will assume head coaching duties in 2012.

Vitt has obtained solid results from veterans, while also helping develop younger players. Under his supervision, Jonathan Vilma has led the Saints in tackles three of the last four seasons and been selected to the Pro Bowl twice. With 646 tackles since joining the club in 2006, Scott Shanle has more stops than any other Saints defender during this period. Vitt helped Jo-Lonn Dunbar enjoy a breakout campaign in his fourth season in 2011, as he started 14 games at both middle and outside linebacker positions and finished third on the team with 90 tackles, one sack, seven pass defenses and two forced fumbles.

Vitt came to the Saints after serving as interim head coach for the final 11 games in St. Louis in 2005. He held the Rams together during a difficult period after previously holding the title of assistant head coach/linebackers.

He joined St. Louis after working as linebackers coach in Kansas City from 2000-03. It was with the Chiefs where he first worked with former Saint Scott Fujita, a fifth-round pick who developed into one of Kansas City's top defenders and led them in tackles twice. Under Vitt's tutelage in New Orleans, Fujita enjoyed three consecutive 100-plus tackle seasons.

Vitt took over the linebacker corps in Kansas City after tutoring the Green Bay defensive backs in 1999, doubling the Packers' previous-year total by picking off 26 passes.

From 1995-98, Vitt was linebackers coach for Philadelphia. In 1998, his group helped the Eagles lead the NFL in pass defense, allowing 170 yards per game. Vitt was assistant head coach and defensive backs coach with the Rams under Chuck Knox from 1992-94 for the franchise's final three seasons in Los Angeles.

Vitt spent 10 seasons with the Seattle Seahawks (1982-91), holding several titles during that stretch. In 1982 he was defensive quality control coach/assistant strength & conditioning coach. From 1983-87, Vitt was quality control/assistant linebackers coach, and from

Vitt played four years at linebacker for Towson State, where he was part of a squad that went undefeated in 1974. He entered the NFL coaching ranks with the Baltimore Colts as strength/quality control coach from 1979-81.

GAME SUMMARY

The Texans lost 40-33, dropping their record to 2-1, despite outgaining the Saints 473-454, winning the turnover battle and punting only twice. There were five lead changes in the game, and the Texans couldn't convert after getting the ball back with 2:42 remaining and a chance to tie.

New Orleans scored 23 points in the fourth quarter to overcome a 26-17 Texans lead. The Texans scored two touchdowns in the fourth but also had three drives that netted one yard or less. Texans K Neil Rackers had four field goals, all from within 36 yards. Three of those came in the first half, when the Texans put up 301 yards but only 16 points.

QB Matt Schaub threw for 373 yards and three touchdowns in a losing effort. The Saints' Drew Brees nearly matched him with 370 and three touchdowns of his own. WR Andre Johnson finished with seven catches for 128 yards. FB James Casey had a career-high five catches for 126 yards and a touchdown. RB Ben Tate, making his first-career start, had 19 carries for 82 yards.

The Texans opened the scoring with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Schaub to Owen Daniels. Houston increased the lead to 10-0 on a 22-yard field goal by Rackers 3:43 left in the first quarter. Darren Sproles' 30-yard touchdown run cut the lead to 10-7. Rackers put the Texans up 13-7 midway through the second quarter with a 27-yard field goal.

Texans CB Johnathan Joseph picked off Brees at the Saints' 38-yard line on the first play of the next drive, eventually leading to another Rackers field goal and a 16-7 lead. The Saints answered with a 35-yard field goal with 35 seconds left in the first half to cut the lead to 16-10.

The Saints took the lead on the first drive of the second half with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Brees to WR Robert Meachem. The Texans responded with a 36-yard field goal by Rackers with 5:08 left in the third quarter.

FS Danieal Manning picked off Brees near midfield on the Saints' next drive. Four plays later, Casey made a diving touchdown catch on 3rd-and-6 from the New Orleans 26, and the Texans led 26-17 with 14:54 remaining. The lead was trimmed to two points on a 27-yard touchdown catch by Jimmy Graham at the 9:35 mark.

The Saints reclaimed the lead following Schaub's interception with a 16-yard touchdown catch by Lance Moore. A 2-point conversion catch by Moore pushed the lead to 32-26. The Texans regained the lead with 4:13 remaining on a wild touchdown catch by WR Kevin Walter

The Saints went on top for good with 2:42 left to play on a 13-yard touchdown run by rookie Mark Ingram. Another two-point conversion catch by Moore made the score 40-33. The Texans got the ball back with two timeouts, but they were unable to gain a first down.

GAME SUMMARY

With a near-perfect performance by QB Matt Schaub and another return for a touchdown by WR Trindon Holliday, the Texans churned out a physical preseason victory over the San Francisco 49ers on Saturday at Reliant Stadium.

The Texans' starting offense played for the entire first half. The first-team defense played seven minutes into the second quarter. Houston led 10-6 at halftime en route to a 20-9 victory over the defending NFC West champions, who sat most of their starters early in the second quarter.

Schaub was 11-of-14 for 128 yards and a touchdown. He averaged 9.1 yards per pass attempt. He threw a nine-yard touchdown pass to WR Lestar Jean in the final minute of the second quarter.

Holliday scored on an 87-yard punt return in the fourth quarter. It was the second consecutive game with a touchdown for the third-year receiver, returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown in the first week of the preseason against the Carolina Panthers.

Jean had a team-high four catches for 42 yards. Pro Bowl WR Andre Johnson had two catches for 49 yards in his 2012 preseason debut. RB Arian Foster had 10 carries for 46 yards (4.6 average) after carrying the ball only once in the preseason opener.

Schaub led the Texans on a seven-play, 37-yard scoring drive to start the game. K Shayne Graham gave Houston a 3-0 lead with a 48-yard field goal.

The Texans sacked QB Alex Smith twice on the 49ers' first drive, giving them 10 sacks in the preseason. DEs Tim Jamison and Antonio Smith teamed up for a sack on third-and-seven from the 26 to force a 50-yard field goal by David Akers. Jamison and OLB Connor Barwin combined for a sack earlier in the drive.

Rookie Texans K Randy Bullock missed a 51-yard field goal wide right early in the second quarter. The Texans were in position to score because of a sensational 43-yard catch by Johnson on a play-action pass from Schaub. Schaub rolled right and heaved the ball across his body to the left for Johnson, who out-jumped two 49ers defensive backs on the play.

The 49ers took a 6-3 lead midway through the second quarter with a 36-yard field goal by Akers. Schaub put the Texans up 10-6 with his touchdown pass to Jean in the final minute of the first half, capping a 12-play, 80-yard drive.

QB T.J. Yates came in for Schaub in the third quarter and went 5-of-9 for 30 yards. He led a seven-play, 41-yard scoring drive that ended with a 49-yard field goal by Graham. The drive was keyed by a 32-yard pass interference penalty on a pass intended for rookie WR Keshawn Martin, who finished the game with three catches for 36 yards.

On the 49ers' next drive, third-string quarterback Josh Johnson completed a 32-yard pass to rookie WR A.J. Jenkins past CB Alan Ball. That set up a 55-yard field goal by Akers, which made the score 13-9.

Holliday provided the winning margin with his touchdown four minutes into the fourth quarter. He fielded a 40-yard punt by 49ers Pro Bowl P Andy Lee at the 13-yard line and raced up the right sideline on his way to the end zone.

Rookie QB Case Keenum entered the game on the Texans' next possession with seven minutes left to play and completed 1-of-3 passes for 20 yards. The Texans ran the final 3:47 off the clock to ice the game.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 19, 2012

(on any injuries from last night's game) "Probably the biggest one is Cush's (Brian Cushing) bruised ribs. He didn't miss any of his time. He played extremely well. He's pretty sore today so I think he'll be day-to-day. Obviously, we're not going to do anything today or really tomorrow. We're just going to correct some mistakes. All the guys that are nicked up should be back on the field Tuesday."

(on RT Derek Newton's play) "He did pretty good. He continues to flash. He's a young player that flashes the ability to be one heck of a player. We're trying to find that consistency there along the way but I think he took a step forward. We gave him an opportunity to start. I think he took advantage of it. I think he went out there and did some good things. We still got to get it totally consistent. (RT Rashad) Butler played well also in the game. That battle is going to go until the very end. On who starts this week, we'll wait and see. But it was a good outing for both those guys."

(on NT Earl Mitchell and NT Sunny Harris) "We're trying to go right down the middle and play them as if we were playing a regular season game. Rotate those two guys. When Shaun (Cody) is in there, we rotate Shaun and Earl (Mitchell). I want to say they played like 19 plays and 23 plays, respectively, so pretty much down the middle. Earl (Mitchell) continues to grow as a player. We have really liked what we have seen from Sunny (Harris) throughout camp but he has missed some time with an injury, a muscle issue, but was able to make it through last week. He did play and it was a positive step for him. He did some good things in the game."

(on giving WR DeVier Posey reps with the first team) "The way it kind of played out last night, the guys that are working with the third group did not get many reps last night. It's just the way the game came out. I wish I would have got DeVier (Posey) a little bit more but those other two guys (WR Keshawn Martin and WR Lestar Jean) are playing extremely well. They're picking things up extremely well. I wouldn't say that DeVier is not doing the same things. I would not say that. I just think that it has taken him a little bit more time to get going with the offense, so to speak. I mentioned many times throughout the course of the month, he did miss a year of football in a lot of ways last year but his ability shows up. He had a chance to make a play. Case (Keenum) missed him there late in the game trying to give him a chance to make a play. He will get plenty of time between this week, we're going to play our starters a bunch this week but before this preseason is over, he'll get plenty of time."

(on the kicking battle between K Shayne Graham and K Randy Bullock) "He (Graham) was good last night. He made his two kicks and Randy (Bullock) missed his one but he's done a good job. They've both done a pretty good job kicking off. The biggest thing with those two guys, that battle is going to be decided. There's so many things going on. We're looking at the big picture. Not just one preseason game or one practice. We've been charting them the whole time. It's very very close. One's a veteran guy and one's a young guy with a lot of talent that's got to prove that he can do it. It's going to be a tough decision. They're both making it tough on us but Shayne (Graham) did a good job last night."

(on letting K Randy Bullock do all the kicking in the preseason to get him ready for the regular season) "Well, we're not going to give anybody anything. You got to earn it to be out there and competition

makes everybody better. It's been very competitive in camp. It's been very close. It has kind of went back and forth each and every day. I think in the long haul, obviously one of them is going to be our kicker and I wouldn't be surprised if the other one is kicking somewhere else so that's good for our team. We'll see how it plays out. We got a couple weeks to work through it."

(on how much it helped to play a hard team in preseason) "Oh, it helps a lot. I said after the game, that first half of football was a very physical game, two teams getting after it. And it is a preseason, but that was a very real picture for us I think as a team of where we're heading and where we have to be here in a couple weeks. Got a lot of respect for the program and the job that they do. It was a good test for our one's; our one's were able to look at a good first half of football both offensively and defensively and kind of evaluate themselves and see where they need to go this week."

(on if the starters will play more against New Orleans) "Yeah, my plan always in the third preseason game is to hopefully play them three quarters. Sometimes I've done that, sometimes I've taken them out before that period of time is over, but I want their mindset to be that they're going to go three quarters this week because, in a lot of ways, it is their last tune up before we (play) Miami."

(on how QB Case Keenum did against San Francisco) "I thought he did fine, he made a great play. We're in a position right there, it's tough as a coach because you're trying to put that game away, you're probably not throwing the ball there with five or six minutes left, but I wanted to give the young man a chance to make some plays. He made a great play in the first play on the boot, he made a great throw. He missed (WR) DeVier (Posey) on the deep over route that would have been a nice play for both of them to make, but I like what he's done, I like the way he handles himself, he handles the group. You always want more reps for all those guys but they're hard to come by. We'll have to, it's like everything else, take everything into account here as we move forward and decide what we're going to do behind (QB) Matt (Schaub) and (QB) T.J. (Yates). So it's a good battle going on between him and (QB John) Beck."

(on what WR Lestar Jean did this offseason to put himself in position to make plays) "Well, he had a good offseason. He was very good in our program as far as working and that type of thing. I do know this, there was a period of time when OTAs are over and when camp starts nowadays in the NFL it's about five weeks or something where coaches and players are in no contact with each other, but I know this, I know that he was in (QB) Matt (Schaub)'s hip pocket and worked extremely hard with (QB) Matt (Schaub). I think it shows. I just think he knows what he's doing now so it's not hard for him to go out there and play. As far as assignment-wise, his talents kind of take over. He's gaining confidence with every play that he makes. All the skill is there, and I don't think he has a chance to be a good player, I think he has a chance to be a really good player. So that's what we're pushing him toward."

(on if he knew WR Lestar Jean had star potential when he signed him) "Well, the size and ability, that'd be easy to talk about. But I think one thing you never know about players is some guys just when the lights go on, they get a little bit better. It seems like this is that type of young man. He was having a good camp last year but he goes out there

against the Jets and, all the sudden, boom he makes a couple big plays. It's happened this preseason again. That's what you're looking for; some guys find a way to take it up a notch once you hit the field on game day and it sure looks like that's what he tends to do. So that's a good sign."

(on WR Trindon Holliday covering a punt late in the game being an expanded role for him) "I told you, he's going to have to do a lot. We've been planning on doing that with him. Obviously, with that speed and stuff, he can go out there and Trindon's tough, I can see how difficult he is to tackle, too, on the returns, but that's something else we would like him to do. If he's going to make this team as a specialty player, the more snaps we can get him on the field, the better. So if that's something he can do for us, it gives a DB (defensive back) a break when we do have to punt. Those type of things should make our team better."

(on what he saw on film in the first half running the ball and stopping the run) "Well, obviously I don't think we stopped the run the way we need to stop the run. I think we can tackle better when we tackle. They are a good, physical football team. Some of those runs were in situations like third and longs, a lot of third down runs on us, so that's something we've got to shore up. As far as us running the ball, we came out aggressive throwing the ball early. I think we only ran like eight or nine plays in the first quarter. I did want (RB) Arian (Foster) to touch the ball 10 times, and I think he actually had 10 carries in the game. I thought as he got going, he got better. We can always play better up front, but I thought our one's were pretty good and our two's, offensively, I was disappointed in how we played; we played a lot better last week than we played last night."

(on CB Brandon Harris playing really well) "Yeah, he really is. Throughout this camp, guys' names come up like (TE) Garrett Graham, players like that, (ILB) Mister Alexander, guys taking a big step early in their career, showing a lot of improvement, and I think you got to put B (Brandon Harris) in there. From the last four, five days of OTAs throughout this training camp, he's become a better player every time he steps on the field; that's been important. And the thing I liked last night, he responded. He needs to play better on special teams for us, and he did that last night. He and I talked about it last week, and he came back and did a pretty good job."

(on FS Shiloh Keo having to play some in the box last night) "We played dime, which you've got one backer (linebacker) on the field or if we go to nickel and you've got two backers, it all depends on what's going on, but he can get caught in that box. It happens to GQ (Glover Quin) on some of the things we do. That was my point when you're asking about running the ball on us. They ran the ball in nickel on us on some third downs when we had our smaller group on the field, our cover group on the field. If we do that, then guys like Shiloh and that have to hold up. We've got to tackle and find a way to get off the field. He's very aggressive. He made some good plays last night."

(on if DE J.J. Watt has any chance of playing in one of the last two preseason games) "I think we're very close. I was just talking to Kap (head athletic trainer Geoff Kaplan). He's going to go to work starting tomorrow doing a lot of sled work and position specific type stuff. He will still work with the trainers. I think we are very close to getting him on the field and to say later this week would probably get me really excited, but

I think to say that he'll be on the field next week, getting his reps with the defense, would probably be a pretty fair assessment at this point."

(on how nice it was for him to see QB Matt Schaub and WR Andre Johnson connect for a couple passes) "That's important. They practiced real good the last 8-10 days to me, because Andre had missed some time and Matt had been rusty. You can see them, in practice, starting to come together a little bit. That's very important because that gives confidence to our whole offense. Watching some of these young kids, it looks like will contribute to our football team, we could end up very strong at a position we were pretty concerned with going into this camp. So hopefully these guys keep moving forward and Andre and Matt continue to play the way they've always played for us."

(on what he was most disappointed at during the game) "Probably our second group offensively, I guess, if I'm going to go to one place. I thought we had taken some good steps last week. We're trying to get Brandon Brooks a lot of reps. We had three or four holding calls with the group and we just didn't operate very smoothly and I wanted to see those guys take a step forward. Now in the same breath, let me say this, (C) Ben Jones is playing very well. The young center is playing very well with that group. He's been a bright spot throughout camp and you guys can see him continue get more reps."

(on one thing he was happiest about from the game) "Our effort. I liked the way we were playing. We were playing hard offensively, defensively, special teams. We're making mistakes, but when you play hard, you find ways to still win games through mistakes. You come correct them the next day, so I love our effort as a team right now."

(on if the team always plays hard) "We're supposed to. Hopefully we keep doing that."

(on how he can tell if the team is playing hard than another game) "I'm not saying we played harder this week than last week. I think we pride ourselves on playing with great effort as a team. We really challenge each other. Players are hard on each other. We talk all the time about little plays that are the difference between winning and losing. I'll give you a great example, last night, the play (FB) James Casey makes on the third-and-2 is the difference between being up 10-6 at halftime or being down. Plays like that are the difference. He makes another great play on Arian (Foster)'s run three plays later. He played extremely well in the game. We always talk about those types of plays as a team because we think they're the difference when it's all said and done, week-in and week-out, of winning. We need to continue that effort."

(on how much of that team effort stems from the team leaders) "It starts with consistency and coaching. I think coaching effort and holding guys accountable and then it filters from the leaders of your team. You're right, if they do it themselves, then they are going to demand it of others and then it filters throughout you're whole football team. That's a good trait to have and we need to hang onto it."

(on NT Shaun Cody) "We expect Shaun to start running tomorrow. We'll see where we're at. He'll be day-to-day."

GENERAL MANAGER AND EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT RICK SMITH



Rick Smith is in his seventh season as Texans general manager and second as executive vice president of football operations, overseeing all aspects of football operations. Smith inherited a two-win team when he was named general manager on June 5, 2006 and has since worked closely with the coaching and scouting staffs to build the Texans into a playoff team by identifying and signing elite players who have helped produce an exciting brand of football.

Smith has steadily strengthened Houston's roster through the draft, free agency and trades. His main philosophy has been to build through the draft and supplement via free agency with a thorough and innovative front office staff that has the Texans pointed toward sustained success.

Smith has also been active in league affairs while at the helm of the Texans. He was appointed to the NFL's prestigious Competition Committee by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell on Dec. 5, 2008, and was an original member of the General Managers Advisory Committee, which provides advice and other feedback to the NFL Football Operations department on the integrity of the game, expansion of technology and other ways to improve the game. In addition, Smith has earned recognition from his peers and was honored with the Tank Younger Award in 2008, presented annually by the Fritz Pollard Alliance for outstanding work in an NFL front office.

Smith has orchestrated several trades that have benefited the Texans greatly, including a deal with Atlanta in 2007 that brought quarterback Matt Schaub to Houston. Since then, Schaub has become the Texans' all-time leading passer, the 12th player in NFL history to throw for more than 4,000 yards in back-to-back seasons (2009-10), led the NFL in passing in 2009 with 4,770 yards, was named the 2010 Pro Bowl MVP and has helped lead Houston's offense to a top-four NFL ranking each year from 2008-10. In 2008, Smith traded with Denver for center Chris Myers, who became the first lineman in Texans history to make the Pro Bowl.

Perhaps the best overall draft class of Smith's tenure came in 2009, when the Texans drafted Brian Cushing with the 15th overall pick. The former USC linebacker went on to earn NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and Pro Bowl honors, and led the team in tackles in 2011 for the second time in three years. Smith also signed running back Arian Foster as an undrafted rookie free agent in 2009. Foster had a breakout year in 2010, leading the NFL with 2,220 yards from scrimmage, 20 touchdowns scored and 1,616 yards rushing, the most ever by an undrafted player, in addition to earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors.

In his former role with the Denver Broncos, Smith was responsible for evaluating players from around the NFL as well as those in NFL Europe, the Canadian Football League, the Arena Football League and other professional leagues. He also played a central role in the club's preparation for the college draft and was one of the Broncos' primary negotiators for player contracts.

With Smith heading the pro personnel department, the Broncos posted the league's fifth-best regular-season record from 2000-05, going 61-35 (.635). The 61 wins were the most of any AFC West team during that span, 10 more than the next closest team, Kansas City. Denver was one of only four teams in the NFL to reach the playoffs each season from 2003-05.

TRAINING CAMP DRAWS LARGE CROWDS

The 2012 Houston Texans Training Camp presented by XFINITY drew the largest training camp crowds in franchise history. Fans lined up to get into gates as early as 3 a.m. for the six open practices, which began at 8 a.m.

A record opening-day crowd of 5,012 showed up for practice on July 28 and a franchise-record 5,715 fans were at the July 30 practice. In addition, celebrities of note have also attended practice, including NBA Hall of Famer David Robinson, NBA analyst and former head coach Jeff Van Gundy and Houston-based rapper Paul Wall.

A LOOK BACK AT 2011

THE TEXANS

- Won the AFC South for the first time in team history and earned the franchise's first playoff berth.
- Won the franchise's first playoff game in their postseason debut, defeating Cincinnati 31-10 in the AFC Wild Card game in front of a Reliant Stadium record crowd of 71,725 on Jan. 7, 2012.
- Set franchise records with 10 regular season wins and a seven-game winning streak from 10/23-12/11.
- Matched the best road record in team history, going 5-3 and tying the mark set in 2009.
- Matched the best intra-division record in team history, going 4-2.
- Became the first team to win three consecutive games with three different starting quarterbacks since Tennessee did so in 2003.
- Sold out their 101st consecutive home game (including preseason and postseason) in franchise history in the playoffs against Cincinnati.

THE TEXANS DEFENSE

- Posted the third-largest defensive improvement since 1970, allowing 91.2 fewer yards per game than in 2010. The 1997-98 Oakland Raiders (97.9) and 1976-77 Atlanta Falcons (95.4) are the only teams with larger improvements.
- Ranked second in the NFL in total defense, giving up an average of 285.7 yards per game, a franchise record-low.
- Became the ninth defense since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to hold three consecutive opponents to less than 175 yards of total offense, doing so at Tennessee in Week 7, vs. Jacksonville in Week 8 and vs. Cleveland in Week 9.
- Held 11 opponents to less than 20 points and went 10-1 in those games.
- Ranked fourth in the NFL and set a franchise record for fewest points allowed with 278.
- Registered a franchise-record 44.0 sacks and tied the team single-game record with 7.0 sacks in Week 12 at Jacksonville.

THE TEXANS OFFENSE

- Led the NFL in average time of possession at 32:41 and won the time of possession battle 12 times.
- Set franchise records for rushing yards (2,448) and rushing attempts (546) in a season.
- Finished second in the NFL in rushing offense, averaging 153.0 yards per game.
- Had two players rush for more than 900 yards for the first time in team history (Arian Foster, 1,224; Ben Tate, 942).
- Set the franchise record for fewest interceptions thrown with nine.
- Scored on their opening drive of the game nine times and the opening drive of the second half 10 times.
- Had two players surpass 100 receiving yards in the same game twice - in Week 3 at New Orleans (Andre Johnson, 128; James Casey, 126) and Week 5 vs. Oakland (Arian Foster, 116; Joel Dreessen, 112).
- Had two players surpass 100 rushing yards in the same game twice - in Week 7 at Tennessee (Arian Foster, 115; Ben Tate, 104) and Week 9 vs. Cleveland (Foster, 124; Tate, 115), becoming the sixth team since 1985 to have a pair of 100-yard rushers twice in a season.

PLAYER MILESTONES REACHED IN 2011

CONNOR BARWIN

- Came back from a devastating ankle injury in 2010 to become the second Texan (Mario Williams) to record double-digit sacks in a season with a team-best 11.5.
- Moved into second on the franchise's all-time sack list behind Williams with 16.0 career sacks.
- Set the franchise single-game sack record with 4.0 at Jacksonville in Week 12.
- Named AFC Defensive Player of the Month in November after leading the conference with 6.5 sacks in the month and leading the Texans to a 3-0 record.

DUANE BROWN

- AP All-Pro Second Team
- PFW/PFWA All-AFC Team

JAMES CASEY

- Had 126 yards receiving, the most ever by a Texans running back, in Week 3 at New Orleans. His 62-yard reception in the first quarter was the third-longest by a running back in team history.

BRIAN CUSHING

- Voted Team MVP by his teammates.
- Led the team or tied for the team lead in tackles 10 times, tied a career high with 4.0 sacks and intercepted two passes on the season.
- AP All-Pro Second Team
- PFW/PFWA All-AFC Team

OWEN DANIELS

- Has caught a pass in 67 consecutive games in which he has played.
- Became the first Texan other than Andre Johnson to lead the team in receiving yards (677) since Johnson was drafted in 2003.
- Became the second Texans tight end and first since Billy Miller in 2002 to lead the team in receptions.

ARIAN FOSTER

- Earned his second consecutive Pro Bowl nod after rushing for 1,224 yards and 10 touchdowns along with 617 yards and three touchdowns receiving.
- AP All-Pro Second Team
- Ran for the most yards ever by a player in his first two career playoff games, 285 (153 vs. Cincinnati and 132 at Baltimore).
- Joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Walter Payton (1983) as the only running backs to have two 70-plus-yard touchdown catches in a season since 1970. Foster had 78-yard touchdown receptions in Week 7 at Tennessee and Week 10 at Tampa Bay.
- Became the fifth man in NFL history to post back-to-back seasons with more than 1,000 rushing yards and 600 receiving yards.
- Earned AFC Offensive Player of the Month accolades in October. His 809 yards from scrimmage were the third-most in the month of October in the history of the NFL, trailing only Larry Brown's 851 yards for Washington in 1972 and Eric Dickerson's 829 yards for the Los Angeles Rams in 1983.
- Named AFC Offensive Player of the Week for Week 4 when he carried 30 times for 155 yards and the game-winning touchdown against a Pittsburgh defense that finished No. 1 in the NFL. CONTINUED...

ARIAN FOSTER (CONT.)

- Became the fourth player since the 1970 merger to score three touchdowns and have more than 100 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving in a single game, doing so in Week 7 at Tennessee and earning AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for the second time in 2011.
- Became the first Texans player to surpass 100 yards rushing and receiving in a game in Week 7 at Tennessee, finishing with 234 yards from scrimmage, the second-highest total in his career.
- Set the franchise record for career rushing touchdowns with his 24th in Week 9 vs. Cleveland and now has 29 career rushing touchdowns.
- Tied a franchise record by scoring at least one rushing touchdown in six consecutive games, matching Domanick Williams' streak in 2004.
- Surpassed 4,000 career yards from scrimmage in Week 14 at Cincinnati and finished the year with 4,411 career scrimmage yards, good for third in team history.
- Surpassed 3,000 career rushing yards in Week 16 at Indianapolis. His 3,097 career rushing yards are second-most in Texans history behind Domanick Williams' 3,195.

BRETT HARTMANN

- Set a team record with a 44.4 punting average, besting Matt Turk's mark of 42.8 in 2009.
- Set franchise records with 23 kickoff touchbacks for the season and 6 touchbacks in a game (vs. Indianapolis, 9/11/11).

ANDRE JOHNSON

- Became the second-fastest player to reach 700 career receptions when he did so in his 120th game in Week 12 at Jacksonville.
- Has caught at least one pass in his last 82 games played, a franchise record.
- Surpassed 90 receiving yards in four of the seven games in which he played.

JOHNATHAN JOSEPH

- Earned his first Pro Bowl selection after intercepting a team-leading four passes in his first season with the team.
- AP All-Pro Second Team

BRICE McCAIN

MATT SCHAUB

- Evened his record as the Texans' starting quarterback at 32-32 in Week 11 at Tampa Bay before suffering a season-ending injury.
- Set a franchise record by throwing at least one touchdown pass in 16 straight games from 11/14/10-10/30/11.
- Became the Texans' all-time completions leader in Week 3 at New Orleans. His second completion of the game gave him 1,244 as a Texan.
- Set the franchise record for career pass attempts in Week 8 vs. Jacksonville when he threw his 2,071st pass as a Texan.
- Became the first quarterback since Brett Favre in 2007 to throw two touchdown passes of 78 yards or longer when he did so at Tampa Bay in Week 11.
- Tied a career high with two rushing touchdowns on the season.

ANTONIO SMITH

- Registered sacks in each of the first five games of the season and had 4.5 sacks through Week 4.
- Finished the year with a career-high 6.5 sacks.
- Selected to his first career Pro Bowl.

WADE SMITH

- Recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown in Week 6 at Baltimore, making him the first Texans offensive lineman to score a touchdown and the 45th offensive lineman in NFL history to recover a fumble for a touchdown.

BEN TATE

- Became the 11th man in NFL history to rush for at least 100 yards in each of his first two professional games, posting 116 yards vs. Indianapolis and 103 at Miami.
- Ran for 116 yards in his NFL debut vs. Indianapolis, which was the most by a Texans back in his first game with the team.

J.J. WATT

- Had a fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Indianapolis, a blocked field goal in Week 2 at Miami and a sack in Week 3 at New Orleans.
- Joined Brooks Reed as the ninth pair of rookie teammates to each record at least 5.0 sacks and the first duo since Jason Taylor and Derrick Rodgers for Miami in 1997.
- Voted team's Rookie of the Year by his teammates.
- PFW/PFWA All-Rookie Team

KEVIN WALTER

- Caught the 300th pass of his career in Week 10 vs. Cleveland on a 5-yard reception.

T.J. YATES

- Made his NFL debut in Week 12 at Jacksonville and made his first career start the following week vs. Atlanta.
- Was the first rookie quarterback to lead fourth-quarter game-winning drives in each of his first two career starts since Virgil Carter did so for the Chicago Bears in 1968.
- Became the first Texans rookie to pass for 300 yards in a game when he did so in Week 14 at Cincinnati (26-of-44, 300 yards, 2 TD, 1 INT), earning Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week honors for his play.

PRACTICE GUIDELINES

Media will be allowed at all practices. During each practice, the team will use two practice fields. The area between the two practice fields – where the scissor lift is located – is off-limits to media, but media can walk the perimeter of the fields.

Photographers can only cross the covered area if they are accompanied by a Texans PR representative. Photographers can shoot selected portions of practice. Tripods are allowed at practice, however they must be seven yards from the sideline and behind the line of scrimmage at all times. Please do not leave tripods unattended. To not impede the view of the fans at practice, all photographers must kneel when shooting in front of the stands.

Members of the communications staff will be on the field during all practices to assist with any questions. During practices held inside the bubble, all media must stay on the near sideline.

CREDENTIAL PICK-UP

For credential pick-up at training camp, there will be a booth at the entrance of the Methodist Training Center. Media should park in the Teal Lot located on the corner of Murworth and Kirby to pick up credentials beginning Saturday, July 28 during player availability.

All television stations airing live newscasts should set up at the south end of field one (lighted) or next to the practice facility building, with satellite truck parking available in the Teal Lot. For radio stations wishing to broadcast from Texans Training Camp, phone lines are available in the Texans media room at no charge.

GAME SUMMARY

Sparked by kick returner Trindon Holliday and a dominant defense, the Texans cruised to a 26-13 victory in their preseason opener against the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium.

The Texans' starters played three series apiece on both sides of the ball, building a 10-3 lead that turned into a 26-13 victory. Holliday had a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter, and the Texans' defense, led by 1.5 sacks from rookie first-round draft pick Whitney Mercilus, totaled eight sacks and limited the Panthers to 137 yards, including 13 in the second half.

Texans QB Matt Schaub completed 3-of-6 passes for 52 yards with one interception in his first game since suffering a Lisfranc injury on Nov. 7. WR Andre Johnson did not play because of a groin injury. Rookie Keshawn Martin started in his place and had two catches for 24 yards and one carry for 12 yards on an end around.

The Texans' defense forced reigning NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year Cam Newton and the Panthers to a three-and-out on both of their first two series. CB Kareem Jackson broke up a pass on third down to end the first drive. OLB Brooks Reed sacked Newton for a 10-yard loss on the second.

Schaub led a nine-play, 65-yard scoring drive on the Texans' first series. He was 3-of-4 for 52 yards, putting the Texans in position for a 20-yard field goal by Shayne Graham.

RB Arian Foster's only carry of the night came on the Texans' next series. He gained 11 yards before losing a fumble at midfield, which led to a 35-yard field goal by Carolina's Olindo Mare.

Holliday returned the ensuing kickoff for a touchdown, darting through a seam on the right side and bolting to the end zone. Schaub was hit as he threw and picked off by Panthers LB Jason Phillips over the middle two plays into the Texans' next series.

T.J. Yates relieved Schaub late in the first quarter. The second-year quarterback was sharp, completing 8-of-12 passes for 89 yards. He led two scoring drives that ended in field goals, which were sandwiched around a 1-yard touchdown run by Panthers RB Tauren Poole.

The Texans' defense limited the Panthers to two first downs in the second half. They also had five sacks and two takeaways, a third-quarter interception by S Troy Nolan and fourth-quarter fumble recovery by rookie NT Hebron Fangupo.

Mercilus and ILB Tim Dobbins both had 1.5 sacks on the night. Reed and OLB Jesse Nading, Bryan Braman and D.J. Bryant each had one sack.

Undrafted rookie RB Jonathan Grimes ran for a 3-yard touchdown in the third quarter to give the Texans a 23-13 lead. It capped an 11-play, 61-yard drive led by QB John Beck, who went 4-of-6 for 46 yards in his Texans debut.

Texans rookie QB Case Keenum made his NFL debut in the fourth quarter and was 2-of-3 for 33 yards with four carries for eight yards.

Rookie K Randy Bullock closed out the scoring with a 52-yard field goal with 1:57 remaining in the game.
